HO-1 CHERRY GROVE Brookville Private

Circa 1768

Cherry Grove was built by Captain Benjamin Warfield shortly after 1766 when he acquired the land grant comprising some 550 acres laid out by Henry Griffith known as Fredericksburg.

The central section of the house dating from the eighteenth century is a one and a half story frame house, three bays wide and two bays deep, crowned by a gambril roof running east—west with two north and south shed roofed dormers and a wide brick chimney inset into its west wall with double flue.

A two story gabled roof west wing two bays wide and one room deep dates from 1810 and holds a west chimney. A one and a half story east wing two bays wide and two bays deep dates from 1907. Two south elevation shed roofed dormer windows are set into its gambril roof.

One way enclosed stairs lie on the west walls of the two earlier sections, while the central section features outstanding interior cherry paneling.

Though its construction spans three centuries, its architectural integrity and continuity have been maintained as well as a sensitivity to the original scale of the building.

Cherry Grove is a three sectional house whose central one and a half story, gambril roof, three bay wide section was erected in 1768 by Captin Benjamin Warfield. It features north and south rectangular entrance doors surmounted by transoms, two shed roofed dormers holding rectangular double-hung windows with six-over-six lites placed on the north and south elevations, and a wide brick chimney set into its west wall.

An early 1810 addition lies along the west wall of the original structure facing south. It is a two story high frame structure, two bays wide and one room deep with west chimney and gable roof. Its rectangular entrance door lies in the east bay of the south wall. Both south entrances of these early sections to the house are covered by a one story shed roofed open porch which extends along their entire south elevations and is held by six wooden posts.

A similar porch lies on the north wall of the central section. In 1907 the east wing was added to the east wall of the central section. Strictly adhering to the existing scale of that building, it holds a north-south hallway approached by a south rectangular entrance door. It is three bays wide, two bays deep, one and a half stories high crowned by a gambril roof which holds two shed roofed dormer windows.

A rectangular entrance is located in the south bay of the east wall, covered by a one story shed roofed porch.

The interior features one way enclosed and stairs on the west walls of the two earlier sections, while the central section features outstanding cherry paneling.


Accessory buildings and barns lie east and northeast of the house.

Considered to be the seat of the Warfield family of Howard County, Cherry Grove stands on a land grant known as Fredericksburg and owned originally by Henry Griffith. Acquired by Captain Benjamin Warfield in 1766, he shortly after built the central section of the present house, three bays wide, two bays deep and one and a half stories high crowned by a gambril roof holding two north and south shed roofed dormer windows. It is listed in both the Howard County General Plan and on a map developed by the Howard County Historical Society as a building of outstanding historical significance. It should be considered for inclusion into the National Register and any future local landmark legislation. It has been recommended to be designated as a critical area of State concern suitable for preservation.
