Description:

This house is located on the west side of the road and faces south toward a driveway into the property and the property to the west. It is about 1 ½ miles southwest of Elkridge in eastern Howard County, Maryland. The house is a 1½-story, three-bay by two-bay frame structure with a poured concrete foundation, aluminum siding, and a gable roof with asphalt shingles and an east-west ridge. The eaves are overhanging by about 8 inches and are boxed. There is a one-story, two-bay by one-bay frame addition on the west end that has a CMU foundation, aluminum siding, and a shed roof with asphalt shingles. The roof slopes down to the west. The south elevation has a shed-roofed addition or enclosed porch across all three bays, and it has non-historic casement windows and a metal door with a single sidelight. The main block has two shed-roofed dormers with a six-over-six sash.

Significance:

The house at 6224 Hanover Road is a transitional structure, part bungalow and part Cape Cod. It is not clear whether the enclosed front section was originally a porch or is a completely modern addition, which affects the interpretation of the building. The pair of dormers on the front is more typical of a Cape, though they would often be gabled; the shed roof was more common in a bungalow, but would often be one large dormer covering two or three bays. The tax assessment records date the construction of the building to 1930, which is early for a Cape Cod and late for a bungalow, but given the apparent transitional nature of the building, this date seems reasonable. The bungalow seems to be the most popular middle-class housing type in Howard County in the first quarter of the twentieth century, and the Cape Cod seems to have replaced it, especially after World War II. This building is scheduled to be demolished in 2010 for redevelopment of the parcel.

The house is a 1 ½-story, three-bay by two-bay frame structure with a poured concrete foundation, aluminum siding, and a gable roof with asphalt shingles and an east-west ridge. The eaves are overhanging by about 8 inches and are boxed. There is a one-story, two-bay by one-bay frame addition on the west end that has a CMU foundation, aluminum siding, and a shed roof with asphalt shingles. The roof slopes down to the west. The south elevation has a shed-roofed addition or enclosed porch across all three bays, and it has non-historic casement windows and a metal door with a single sidelight. The main block has two shed-roofed dormers with a six-over-six sash. The east elevation has an exterior brick chimney in the south bay, and a one-over-one sash in both the north bay and the gable end. The north elevation has three one-over-one sash on the first story and a shed-roofed dormer with paired one-over-one sash and asphalt shingles on the cheek walls. The west elevation has a one-over-one sash in both the north bay and the gable end. The south bay is covered by the addition. This has a one-over-one sash on the north elevation, two one-over-one sash on the west elevation, and a door in the foundation that opens below grade. The ground is excavated here to walk out, and the ground slopes down to the west. The south elevation of the addition has a one-over-one sash and a modern door with nine lights over one large panel. There is a modern wood deck on the south side of the addition.


