Oakley Farm faces south on the northside of Route 144 at its intersection with Daisy Road. It is a five bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame building, resting on a stone foundation, connected to, and forming an "L" plan with a seven bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south hipped at its connection with the east wing), frame west wing, resting on a stone foundation, with square brick chimneys, inset into its north and east exterior walls and the roof line broken in the southwest corner of the building complex by a square brick, interior end chimney.

A two bay wide, one room deep, one story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame east appendage, resting on a stone foundation, is placed just north of center on the east wall of the east wing. Another three bay wide, one bay deep, two story high, shed roofed, east appendage, runs along the three central bays of the west wing's east wall.

One story high, shed roofed open porches, supported by wooden posts, run along most of the west elevation, the central bay of the south elevation and the entire north elevation of the west wing.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Oakley Farm faces south on the northside of Route 144 at its intersection with Daisy Road. It is a five bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame building, resting on a stone foundation, connected to, and forming an "L" plan with a seven bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south hipped at its connection with the east wing), frame west wing, resting on a stone foundation, with square brick chimneys, inset in to its north and east exterior walls and the roof line broken in the southwest corner of the building complex by a square brick, interior end chimney.

A two bay wide, one room deep, one story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame east appendage, resting on a stone foundation, is placed just north of center on the east wall of the east wing. Another three bay wide, one bay deep, two story high, shed roofed, east appendage, runs along the three central bays of the west wing's east wall.

One story high, shed roofed open porches, supported by wooden posts, run along the south five bays of the west elevation, the central bay of the south elevation and the entire north elevation of the west wing.

Rectangular, open bible and cross paneled entrances are placed in the south end bay and third north bay of the west elevation, as well as the central bay of the south elevation. The third north bay entrance on the west elevation is fronted by a square, enclosed vestibule, with rectangular double-hung window centered on its west wall and a south entrance.

Fenestration for the house is rectangular and double-hung, holding six-over-six lights, underlined by projecting wooden sills and decorated with wooden shutters.

THE WEST ELEVATION

The west facade holds the two main entrances, previously mentioned, and five first floor windows, similar to those described. A one story high open porch covers the first five south bays of this wall. Windows are all spaced in pairs on the second floor, except that on the north end bay.

THE SOUTH ELEVATION

The south elevation of the east wing holds a central, rectangular, cross paneled entrance door, covered by a shed roofed open porch and flanked by two first floor windows, similar to those described. Above are five regularly spaced, second floor windows.

The south elevation of the east wing's gabled roof appendage holds two first floor windows, similar to those described.

THE EAST ELEVATION

The east elevation of the east wing holds two square, four light, attic, casement windows. A very wide brick chimney is centered into this wall.

The east wall of the frame appendage constructed just north of center, along the east wall of the east wing holds no openings.

The east elevation of the west wing holds two first and second floor windows in its two north bays. Along its three central bays, a three bay wide, one bay deep, two story high, shed roofed addition has been constructed. It holds a rectangular, four light entrance door in its south bay, covered by a one story high, shed roofed, open porch, supported by two wooden posts. Two first floor windows, similar to those described, are placed north of the entrance with three, similar, second floor windows above. A square brick chimney rises from the center of this wall.

The two south bays of the west wing's east wall are taken up by their connection to the west wall of the east wing.

THE NORTH ELEVATION

The north elevation of the west wing holds a rectangular beaded batten wood, first floor entrance door, west of center and a double-hung attic window, holding six-over-three lights, east of center. A one story high, shed roofed open porch, supported by three wooden posts runs along this entire elevation. The west side of this porch is enclosed to create a wind breaker and holds a rectangular, double-hung window, with one-over-one lights.

The north wall of the two story high, shed roofed appendage, constructed along the east wall of the west wing, holds no openings.

The two east bays of the east wing's north wall, which remain exposed to view, hold two first and second floor windows, similar to those described. The north wall of the one story high, gabled roof appendage off the east wall of the east wing holds a rectangular, four light entrance door in its west end, with two first floor windows, similar to those described lying east of the entrance.

The manner in which this house is constructed, joined at its southwest corner by a hipped roof, make this a very interesting building. The very wide brick chimney on the east wall of the east wing suggests this section was constructed first, and later enlarged by the west wing and other additions.

Farm outbuildings lie northwest of the residence which sits back quite a distance from Route 144. The property is now bounded on the north by Route 70N.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Oakley Farm is notable historically to the State of Maryland and Howard County as one of the oldest existing Warfield homes in Howard County and significant architecturally as a building composition, spanning two centuries.

The following excerpts regarding the history of Oakley Farm are taken from an article, written by Celia M. Holland, entitled Landmarks of Howard County, Maryland, published at University Park, August, 1975. The author not only lived at Oakley Farm at one time, but is related to the Warfield family and has a private collection of primary sources, which can verify and substantiate the following history:

In 1760 Seth Warfield, great-grandson of Richard Warfield the Emigrant, acquired 700 acres of land in the western part of the county known as Warfield's Folly. During the next thirty-four years he increased his holdings until on July 4, 1794, following a resurvey, he was given a grant of 1800 acres known as Warfield's Forest. The grant included Warfield's, Warfield's Folly, and vacancies, and was one of the larger patents in western Upper Arundel.

Upon Seth's death in 1805 the land passed to five sons: Seth, Beni, Bela, Eli and Azel; two daughters, Mary Ann and Elizabeth, and a granddaughter, Mary Ann, daughter of Bela. Of these heirs Eli, who inherited 250 acres, remained on the homestead which became known as Oakley Farm. His share remained in the family until 1953, meaning that until the mid-twentieth century the land had belonged only "to God, the Indians, and the Warfields." Although the old home is badly in need of repair, it continues to overlook the village of Lisbon which lies to its west.

The first residence was of log. According to family tradition, it was built by the settler and until destroyed by fire, stood atop the front hill on the north side of Route 144. A two-room frame dwelling was then erected which is incorporated in the present house. Known to date back

two centuries, Oakley Farm is one of the oldest Warfield homes extant. The "new" house consisted of a large combination kitchen and sitting room with bedroom above, reached by a closed, winding stairway. Both rooms were heated by fireplaces, an uncommon luxury at the time. Over the years the home was enlarged until it comprised fourteen rooms, two hallways, three bathrooms and a partial cellar. A rambling attic covers all but the east wing which was added in the 1950's.

The house affords large, comfortable rooms, a center hall with winding stairway and handsome walnut bannister and newel post, wide six-panelled doors with box locks and English seals on the knobs, fine random-width oak plank floors, and hand-made mantles. The floor of the west porch is of brick, hand-laid in sand and bordered by long slabs of granite.

Beginning with Seth Warfield who subscribed to the Oath of Allegiance in 1778, various members of the family served in the Revolution and in all the nation's subsequent struggles. Among those who served were Gaithers, Dorseys, Burgesses, Howards, Brices, Bowies, Riggs, Hendersons and Hollands, some of whom did not return from the battlefields.

The house, constructed in several stages in an "L" plan, is representative of vernacular frame architecture in Howard County. The joining of the two major building blocks, however, is unique, utilizing a hipped roof corner, rather than the usual intersecting gable.

Oakley Farm is a frame, two storey, A roofed, ell shaped dwelling of a probable early 19th century construction date (late 18th)

Five bays in length at the west elevation the two doors are positioned the 2nd and 4th bay from the SW corner. On the 2nd level are seven windows all but one end one of which are spaced in pairs.

The S. elevation of the E wing is five bays with the door centered. Above are five regularly spaced windows. There is a two bay single storey addition to its E. end.

Both elevations have single storey farm porches. The roof ridges are broken in several places by interior end chimneys. All windows contain sash of 6/6 panes.




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
