HO-913 Williams-Biller House 9583 Old Annapolis Road Private

Description:

The Williams-Biller House faces northeast toward the road and is a one-story U-plan building with a rock-faced concrete block foundation, vinyl siding, and a gable with a northwest-southeast ridge. The building is four bays by three bays, and the front wings project forward and have gable roofs with northeast-southwest ridges. The siding may cover asbestos shingles. On the northeast elevation, the center two bays have a porch. The northwest elevation of the east wing has a flush door with three lights. The roof pitch on the northeast half is steep while the southeast half has a shallow roof pitch. The southwest elevation has a door with nine lights over a crossbuck. The interior has been completely remodeled and cut up, with a drop ceiling and a raised floor to the rear of the building. This remodeling work all appears to date to the 1970s.

Significance:

The Williams-Biller House sits on two lots in the "Columbia Woodlands" subdivision purchased from the Halloway Company in 1936 by William and Ruth Bond of Baltimore City. The Bonds sold these lots in 1939, at which time they were still residents of Baltimore. It is possible that they built the existing house but did not stay long, or perhaps built it for resale, but most likely Henry and Bobbie Williams were the first to inhabit the new house. They remained there until 1945, when they sold it to the Biller family. The interior of the house was extensively altered by the last residents, the Gregors, and retains no historic integrity. On the exterior the original form of the house remains, a U plan with the entrance between the arms of the U. The house was scheduled to be demolished in June 2006 for redevelopment.

The Williams-Biller House is located at 9583 Old Annapolis Road in the Columbia vicinity in central Howard County, Maryland. The house faces northeast toward the road and is a one-story U-plan building with a rock-faced concrete block foundation, vinyl siding, and a gable with a northwest-southeast ridge. The building is four bays by three bays, and the front wings project forward and have gable roofs with northeast-southwest ridges. The siding may cover asbestos shingles.

On the northeast elevation, the east wing has a pair of one-over-one sash with an aluminum awning and modern trim. The north wing has a single one-over-one sash also with an aluminum awning and modern trim. The center two bays have a porch with beaded-edge-and-center tongue-and-groove-board decking and aluminum on the soffit. There are two one-over-one sash. The northwest elevation of the east wing has a flush door with three lights.

The northwest elevation has three one-over-one sash with aluminum awnings and modern trim. There is a steel bulkhead cellar door in the center. The roof pitch on the northeast half is steep while the southeast half has a shallow roof pitch. The southwest elevation has a one-over-one sash to the west, then a door with nine lights over a crossbuck, a six-light sash, and a projecting wing with sliding glass doors. All of the openings have modern trim. The southeast elevation has two two-light sliding sash with modern trim and aluminum awnings. There is an aluminum porch on the southwest, set to the west, with a concrete deck. To the south is a wood deck with an aluminum roof.

The interior has been completely remodeled and cut up, with a drop ceiling and a raised floor to the rear of the building. This remodeling work all appears to date to the 1970s. There are two rooms in the northwest end wing that have 2 1/4-inch tongue-and-groove pine flooring that runs northwest-southeast. This appears to be the only notable old feature surviving in the building. There is a modern outbuilding behind the house and a modern shed.


