The house at 8813 Old Frederick Road is located on the south side of the road, facing north toward the road, in the community of Rockland just north of Ellicott City in northeastern Howard County, Maryland. The house has an L plan and is a one-story, three-bay by two bay structure with all-stretcher bond brick veneer and some stone quoining at the corners. The west bay projects to the north, creating the L. There is a gable roof with asphalt shingles and an east-west ridge, and the L gable has a north-south ridge. The main roof is carried beyond the front wall creating a porch supported by iron posts. A large, modern, two-story frame addition is on the south elevation.

The house at 8813 Old Frederick Road is an English cottage style that began to be popular nationally in the 1920s and continued to be built into the 1940s. Its rise in popularity was a reflection of the work of British Arts and Crafts architects such as C. F. A. Voysey around the turn of the twentieth century, and was also driven by burgeoning suburban development. These houses often mix brick, stone, and weatherboards, and the use of a façade chimney as a decorative focal point for the house is common. The front porch is not a common feature of this house type, and may reflect a later alteration, as well as the lingering influence of the long-popular bungalow. According to the tax assessment, this house was built in 1945, which would be at the tail end of its popularity, but it still represents a good example of its time and place.

The house at 8813 Old Frederick Road is located on the south side of the road, facing north toward the road, in the community of Rockland just north of Ellicott City in northeastern Howard County, Maryland. The house has an L plan and is a one-story, threebay by two bay structure with all-stretcher bond brick veneer and some stone quoining at the corners. The west bay projects to the north, creating the L. There is a gable roof with asphalt shingles and an east-west ridge, and the L gable has a north-south ridge. The main roof is carried beyond the front wall creating a porch supported by iron posts. On the north elevation, the east bay has a one-over-one sash with blinds. Between the east and center bays is an exterior rubble stone chimney that passes through the porch roof. The center bay has a door. The projecting west bay has paired one-over-one sash with blinds. The gable end above it has a small two-light sash. The east elevation of the projecting ell has an octagonal window with diamond lights and stone framing the opening. The east elevation has a small two-light sash in the south bay and a picture window in the north bay that has one large light flanked by narrow two-light sash. The gable end has two one-over-one sash. A large, modern, two-story frame addition is on the south elevation.




