Description:

The Jones House is located on the west side of the road, just north of the Patuxent River/Howard County line. The house faces east toward the road and is a two-story, three-bay by two-bay frame structure with a CMU foundation, wood weatherboards with corner boards, and a gable roof with an east-west ridge and asphalt shingles. There are one-story shed-roofed wings on the north and south elevations. The interior plan has two rooms across the east with a wide opening between them, and three rooms across the west, with a cross passage and stair. The second story has two chambers, one on the east and one on the west of the center landing. There is a one-story, three-bay by one-bay weather-boarded outbuilding about 30 feet southwest of the house. It has a flat roof that is partly collapsed and is built with 2 by 4s.

Significance:

The Jones House is reputed to have been built in 1950 and is an unusual building type, having its gable end facing the street, and small wings on each side that, on the interior, are not differentiated at all, but simply expand the rooms to usable proportions. The plan is similar to the Berry House (HO-963), just to the north, but with the house turned 90 degrees and the door placed on a gable end. Also, unlike the Berry House, the Jones House is treated the same on both sides, so that the shed-roofed sections read as wings, and the upper story does not read as a shed-roofed dormer. All of the buildings are owned by the Maryland State Department of Natural Resources and are scheduled to be demolished in 2008.

Summary:

The Jones House is located on the west side of the road, just north of the Patuxent River/Howard County line. Description:

The Jones House is located at 4554 Route 97, on the west side of the road, just north of the Patuxent River/Howard County line. The house faces east toward the road and is a two-story, three-bay by two-bay frame structure with a CMU foundation, wood weatherboards with corner boards, and a gable roof with an east-west ridge and asphalt shingles. There are one-story shed-roofed wings on the north and south elevations. There is an interior brick chimney in the center, just south of the ridge.

On the east elevation the first story has a flush wood door with three lights in the center bay, a six-over-one wood sash in the south bay and a six-over-six wood sash in the north bay. The architrave is head-cut and has a small ovolo backband. There is a one-story, three-bay shed-roofed porch that does not extend to cover the wings, and has new turned posts. The second story has two typical six-over-six sash. The south elevation, on the first story, has a two-light sliding sash in the west bay and a typical six-over-six sash in the east bay. The second story has a wood one-over-one sash in the west bay and a typical, but smaller, six-over-six sash in the east bay.

The first story of the west elevation has a wood one-over-one sash with a modern frame in the north bay, a six-light sash in the center, and a modern metal door with nine lights over two panels in the south bay. The second story has a new six-over-six sash in the center. The north elevation has a typical six-over-six sash in the east bay of the first story and a new wood one-over-one sash in the west bay. The second story matches the first.

The interior plan has two rooms across the east with a wide opening between them, and three rooms across the west, with a cross passage and stair. The center room is a bathroom and the southwest room a modern kitchen. There is carpet and linoleum on the floors, drywall, modern flat ogee and bead architrave, and a c. 1920s two-panel door to the cellar stairs. The straight run of stairs ascends to the north. The second story has two chambers, one on the east and one on the west of the center landing.

There is a one-story, three-bay by one-bay weather-boarded outbuilding about 30 feet southwest of the house. It has a flat roof that is partly collapsed and is built with 2 by 4s.


