9757 Washington Boulevard Laurel vicinity

Description:

The house at 9757 Washington Boulevard is located on the southeast side of the road and faces northwest toward the road. It is set close to the road on a site that slopes down to the southeast, exposing the foundation on the southeast side. It is about one mile northeast of Laurel in southeastern Howard County, Maryland. The house is a one-story, four-bay by two-bay brick structure of six to one common bond, with the header courses actually courses of Flemish bond. It has a gable roof that has asphalt shingles and a northeast-southwest ridge. There is a one-bay by one-bay ell on the front, also in brick, with a gable roof ridge that runs northwest-southeast. There is an exterior brick chimney on the southwest gable end, set south of the ridge. The northwest elevation has an enclosed porch with aluminum siding. There is a large, fairly new frame garage attached to the north corner of the house.

Significance:

The house at 9757 Washington Boulevard is an ell form that is a descendent of ell houses popularized at least as early as the 1840s by Andrew Jackson Downing. The ell house became a popular type in the suburbs in the 1890s, and beginning in the 1920s a Cotswold Cottage version, often 1-1/2 stories tall, became popular throughout American suburbs. This example seems to be a simplified version of the English cottage type, without the stylistic details that would have driven up the cost. However, it could have been the influence of Modernism, as much as economics, that drove the simplification of this building, and there are numerous simple examples just like this one throughout postwar suburbs in the United States. This example is not located in a suburb, however, but on Route 1, which was not only an important transportation corridor in the twentieth century, but continued to have a mixed use character of residential, commercial, and industrial structures that spread out from towns like Laurel along the whole length of the road. Despite the unfortunate enclosure of the front porch, the house still conveys its original character. The attached garage is scheduled to be demolished and the house will continue to be residential.

The house at 9757 Washington Boulevard is located on the southeast side of the road and faces northwest toward the road. It is set close to the road on a site that slopes down to the southeast, exposing the foundation on the southeast side. It is about one mile northeast of Laurel in southeastern Howard County, Maryland. The house is a one-story, four-bay by two-bay brick structure of six to one common bond, with the header courses actually courses of Flemish bond. It has a gable roof that has asphalt shingles and a northeast-southwest ridge. There is a one-bay by one-bay ell on the front, also in brick, with a gable roof ridge that runs northwestsoutheast. There is an exterior brick chimney on the southwest gable end, set south of the ridge. The northwest elevation has a two-over-two double hung sash (with horizontal lights, which is typical for this building) in the north bay, which is the ell. The other three bays are an enclosed porch with aluminum siding. The southwest elevation has the enclosed porch to the west. The fireplace is in the west bay of the brick house, with a typical two-over-two double hung sash on either side of it, and another in the south bay. The southeast elevation has a doorway in the south-center bay of the foundation, with three lying lights over three lying panels, and it is set below grade behind a brick stairwell. In the east bay is a two-light sash. The first story has a typical two-overtwo double hung sash in each end bay, paired typical two-over-two double hung sash in the east-center bay, and a door with two lights in the south-center bay. There is a porch at this doorway, with brick piers, concrete steps and deck, new pressure-treated wood railings and posts, and a shed roof. It is connected to a modern deck to the east. The northeast elevation has a typical twoover-two double hung sash in the east bay, a smaller one-over-one sash set just north of center, and a one-over-one sash where the ell joins the main block of the house. There is a large, fairly new frame garage attached to the north corner of the house.


