


SEQUENCE OF CONSTRUCTION

- 1 OBTAIN GRADING PERMIT.
- 2. INSTALL STABILIZED CONSTRUCTION ENTRANCE.
- 3. INSTALL STRAW BALE DIKES.
- 4. INSTALL STONE OUTLET STRUCTURE WITH RELATING PERIMETER DIKE AT CORNER OF ASSATEAGUE DRIVE AND U.S. ROUTE 1 AS SHOWN ON PLAN.
- 5. MASS GRADE THE SITE, MAINTAINING EXISTING SEDIMENT CONTROL POND.
- INSTALL STORM DRAIN/STORM WATER MANAGEMENT SYSTEM.
- 7. BLOCK ALL INLETS IN ACCORDANCE WITH DETAILS SHEET 7 OF 8. 8. CONSTRUCT SEDIMENT TRAPS 2-10 AND INSTALL RELATING
- DIVERSION OR PERIMETER DIKES. 9. UPON APPROVAL OF SEDIMENT CONTROL INSPECTOR REMOVE EXISTING
- RISER & BULKHEAD THE BARRELL. (SEE NOTE SHEET 6 OF 8) 10. ROUGH GRADE TO REMOVE EXISTING SEDIMENT CONTROL POND,
- INSTALL TRAP NO. 1 & RELATING PERIMETER DIKE. STABILIZE ALL PERIMETER GRASSED AREAS IMMEDIATELY AFTER
- ROUGH GRADING IN ACCORDANCE WITH PERMANENT SEEDING NOTES. IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO PAVING, REMOVE EACH SEDIMENT TRAP AS




- 1. Stone size Use MSHA size No. 2 (2-1/2" to 1") or AASHTO designation M43, size No. 2 (2-1/2" to 1-1/2"). Use crushed stone.
- Length As effective, but not less than 50 feet. Thickness - Not less than eight (8) inches.
- Weshing When nacessary, wheels shall be closed to remove sedime prior to entrance onto public right-of-way. When washing is required it shall be done on an area stabilized with crushed stone which drains into an approved sediment trap or sediment basin. All sediment shall

e prevented from entering any storm drain, ditch, or waterco

through use of sand begs, gravel, boards or other approved method 6. Maintenance - The entrance shall be maintained in a condition which will prevent tracking or flowing of sediment onto public rights of way. This may require periodic top dressing with additional stops as conditions demand and repair and/or cleanout of any measures used to trap sediment. All sediment spilled, dropped, washed or tracked outo public rights-of-way must be removed immediately.

1. THE SURFACE DRAINAGE SYSTEM SHALL BE POLYMER CONCRETE STOOK CHANNEL (NEUTRAL CHANNEL SK3-010 AND 2 EACH OF UNITS SK3-9 AND SK3-10) SYSTEM WITH DUCTILE IRON RAIL AND SLOTTED GRATE AS MANUFACTURED BY ACO POLYMER PRODUCTS, INC. CHARDON, OH.,

2. MINIMUM CONCRETE STRENGTH SHALL BE 3500 PSI. THE CONCRETE SHALL BE VIBRATED TO ELIMINATE AIR POCKETS.

3. THE FINISHED LEVEL OF THE CONCRETE SURROUND SHALL BE APPROX. 1/8" ABOVE THE TOP OF THE CHANNEL EDGE.

4. REFER TO MANUFACTURERS LATEST INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETE DETAILS

5. CHANNELS SHALL BE MANUFACTURED FROM POLYESTER RESIN POLYMER CONCRETE WITH AN INTEGRALLY CAST IN DUCTILE IRON RAIL AND SUPPLIED WITH DUCTILE IRON GRATES.


6. THE SYSTEM SHALL BE 12 INCHES NOMINAL INSIDE WIDTH WITH A 14.1 IN.
OVERALL WIDTH AND A BUILT-IN SLOPE OF 0.6% ALL CHANNELS SHALL BE INTERLOCKING WITH A MALE FEMALE JOINT. EACH CHANNEL SHALL HAVE PREFORMED 6 IN. AND 8 IN. SCHEDULE 40 DRILL-OUT ON THE BOTTOM FOR VERTICAL CONNECTION WITH UNDERBROUND FIRMS.


7. GRATES SHALL BE SECURED USING 'POWERLOK' BOLTLESS LOCKING SYSTEM. GRATE AND LOCKING SYSTEM SHALL BE FULLY REMOVABLE PROM CHANNEL.

8. POLYMER CONCRETE SHALL HAVE MATERIAL PROPERTIES OF: COMPRESENTE STRENGTH RANGE.
BETWEEN 14,000-14,500 PSI; FLEXURAL STRENGTH BETWEEN 3600-4500 PSI; TENGILE STRENGTH OF
1500 PSI. THE MATERIAL WATER ARGORPTION RATE SHALL NOT EXCEED 0 1% BY WEIGHT AND SHALL
BE RESIDANT TO PROLONGED SALT EXPOSURE, REPETITIVE PROST CYCLES AND CHEMICALLY
RESISTANT TO DILUTE ACIDS AND ALKALIS.

9. THE SISTEM SHALL BE INSTALLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANUFACTURER'S INSTRUCTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

TRENCH DRAIN DETAIL NOT TO SCALE







- B. Diverted runoff from a disturbed or exposed upland area shall be conveyed to a sediment trapping device such as sediment trap or a sediment basin or to an area protected by any of these practices.
- 4. Stabilization, when required, shall be done in accordance with Standard and Specifications for Grassed Waterway. The minimum
- area to be stabilized shall be the channel flow area. 5. Periodic inspection and required maintenance shall be provided.


Construction Specifications

- 1. Bales shall be placed in a row with ends tightly abutting the adjacent bales.
- 2. Each bale shall be ambedded in the soil a minimum of 4".
- 3. Bales shall be securely anchored in place by stakes or re-bars driven through the bales. The first stake in each bale shall be angled toward previously laid bale to force bales together.
- 4. Inspection shall be frequent and repair or replacement shall be
- made promptly as needed. 5. Bales shall be removed when they have served their usefulness so as not to block or impede storm flow or drainage.


STRAW BALE DIKE




Construction Specifications

- 1. The stone shall be crushed stone. Gravel may be used if crushed stone is not available. The stone shall meet MSHA Size No. 2 or AASHTO designation M43 Size No. 2 or 24.
- 2. The crest of the stone dike shall be at least six inches lower than the lowest elevation of the top of the earth dike and shall be level. 3. The stone outlet structure shall be embedded into the soil a minimum of four inches.
- 4. The minimum length, in feet, of the crest of the stone outlet structure shall be equal to six times the number of acres of contributing drainage
- 5. The stone outlet structure shall be inspected after each rain, and the stone shall be replaced when the structure ceases to function as intended due to silt accumulation among the stone, washout, construction traffic damage, etc.

STONE OUTLET STRUCTURE



- All diversion dikes shall have positive drainage to an outlet. 3. A. Diverted runoff from a protected or stabilized area shall outlet directly to an undisturbed stabilized area or into a level spreader or grade stabilization structure.
- B. Diverted runoff from a disturbed or exposed upland area shall be conveyed to a sediment trapping device such as a sediment trap or a sediment basin or to an area protected by any of these practices.
- 4. Stabilization, as specified by the plans, shall be: (1) in accordance with Standard and Specifications for Grassed Waterway, and the area to be stabilized shall be the channel (flow area); or (2) the flow area shall be lined with stone that meets MSHA size No. 2 or AASHTO M43 size No. 2 or 24 which is placed in a 3 inch thick layer and pressed into the soil. The area covered by the stone shall be as shown on the drawing above.
- Periodic inspection and required maintenance shall be provided.

SEDIMENT CONTROL CONSTRUCTION NOTES GENERAL NOTES

- A MINIMUM OF 24 HOURS NOTICE MUST BE GIVEN TO THE HOWARD COUNTY OFFICE OF INSPECTION AND PERMITS PRIOR TO THE START OF ANY CONSTRUCTION. (922-2070)
- ALL SEDIMENT CONTROL STRUCTURES WILL BE INSTALLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH "THE STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR SOIL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CON-TROL IN DEVELOPING AREAS" AS PREPARED BY THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRI-
 - CULTURE SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE. SITE GRADING WILL BEGIN ONLY AFTER ALL PERIMETER SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES HAVE BEEN INSTALLED AND ARE IN A FUNCTIONING CONDITION.
- 4. ALL DISTURBED AREAS ARE TO BE DRESSED AND STABILIZED ACCORDING TO THE TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT SEEDING SCHEDULES AS SOON AS PROPER WEATHER CONDITIONS EXIST FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A PERMANENT VEGATATIVE COVER.
- SEDIMENT WILL BE REMOVED FROM TRAPS WHEN THE DEPTH REACHES THE CLEAN OUT ELEVATION SHOWN ON THE PLANS.
- FERTILIZER AND LIME RATES MAY BE CHANGED THROUGH AUTHORIZATION BY THE HOWARD SOIL CONSERVATION DISTRICT IF SOIL TESTS DETERMINE A REDUCTION IN THE SPECIFIED RATES IS JUSTIFIED.
- ALL SEDIMENT CONTROL STRUCTURES ARE TO REMAIN IN PLACE AND ARE TO BE MAINTAINED IN OPERATIVE CONDITION UNTIL PERMISSION FOR THEIR REMOVAL HAS BEEN OBTAINED FROM THE HOWARD COUNTY SEDIMENT CONTROL

TEMPORARY SEEDING

AREA TO BE SEEDED SHALL BE RECENTLY LOOSENED. IF THE GROUND IS PACKED, CRUSTED OR HARD, THE TOP LAYER OF SOIL SHALL BE LOOSENED BY DISCING, RAKING OR OTHER ACCEPTABLE MEANS.

- A. APPLY 10-20-10 FERTILIZER (OR EQUIVALENT) AT THE RATE OF 600 LBS. PER ACRE OR 15 LBS. PER 1000 SQ. FT.
- WHERE SOIL IS KNOWN TO BE HIGHLY ACID, APPLY DOLOMITIC LIMESTONE
- WORK BOTH INTO SOIL AND SEED WITH CYCLONE SEEDER, DRILL, CULTIPAKER SEEDER OR HYDROSEEDER (SLURRY WILL INCLUDE SEED AND FERTILIZER) AT THE RATE OF 40 LBS. PER ACRE OF ITALIAN OR PERENNIAL RYEGRASS.
- MULCH WITH UNWEATHERED SMALL GRAIN STRAW AT THE RATE OF 11/2 TO 2 TONS PER ACRE AND ANCHOR WITH A CUTBACK ASPHALT OR EMULSIFIED ASPHALT AT THE RATE OF 5 GAL. PER 1000 SQ. FT.



PERMANENT SEEDING

FINAL STABILIZATION WILL TAKE PLACE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AS WEATHER CONDITIONS PERMIT, AS FOLLOWS:

- A. APPLY DOLOMITIC LIMESTONE AT THE RATE OF 2 TONS PER ACRE (ONE TON PER ACRE IF APPLICATION OF ONE TON PER ACRE WAS MADE FOR TEMPORARY SEEDING)
- B. APPLY 0-20-20 FERTILIZER AT THE RATE OF 600 LBS PER ACRE HARROW OR DISC LIME AND 0-20-20 FERTILIZER INTO THE SOIL TO MINIMUM DEPTH OF 3" LAWNS OR HIGH MAINTENANCE AREAS WILL BE DRAGGED AND LEVELED WITH A YORK RAKE. AT THE TIME OF SEEDING APPLY 400 LBS. OF 30-0-0 UREAFORM FERTILIZER AND 500 LBS. OF 10-20-20 OR EQUIVALENT FERTILIZER PER ACRE.
- C. SEED WITH A MIXTURE OF CERTIFIED "MERION" KENTUCKY BLUEGRASS 40 LBS. PER ACRE; COMMON KENTUCKY BLUEGRASS @ 40 LBS. PER ACRE; RED FESCUE, PENNLAWN OR JAMESTOWN @ 20 LBS. PER ACRE.
- D. MULCH WITH UNWEATHERED SMALL GRAIN STRAW AT THE RATE OF 11/2 TO 2 TONS PER ACRE AND ANCHOR WITH A CUTBACK ASPHALT OR EMULSIFIED ASPHALT AT THE RATE OF 5 GAL. PER 1000 SQ. FT.
- E. SEED ALL SLOPES WITH A MIXTURE OF CERTIFIED KENTUCKY 31 TALL FESCUE @
- 50 LBS. PER ACRE AND INOCULATED KOREAN LESPEDEZA @ 15 LBS. PER ACRE.
- F. SODDED SWALES SHALL BE KENTUCKY 31 TALL FESCUE.

BAYSAVER SYSTEMS MUST BE INSPECTED AND MAINTAINED ERIODICALLY. INSPECTION IS MADE BY CHECKING THE DEPTH O SEDIMENT IN EACH MANHOLE WITH A GRADE STICK OR SIMILAR DEVICE MAINTENANCE IS REQUIRED WHEN THE SEDIMENT DEPTH IN EITHER MANHOLE EXCEEDS 2 FEET. MINIMUM INSPECTION IS REQUIRED TWICE A YEAR TO MAINTAIN OPERATION AND FUNCTION OF BAYSAVER.

INLET AND OUTLET PIPES TO SEPARATOR MANHOLE AND BAYSAVER UNIT. INSTALL PRECAST DROP STRUCTURES ON VERIFY THE SUBGRADE ELEVATION AGAINST THE MANHOLE DIMENSIONS AND CONNECTING STORM DRAIN INVERTS.

. EXCAVATION MUST PROVIDE ADEQUATE SPACE TO CONNECT





PLANTING SPECIFICATIONS


- 1. Plants, related material, and operations shall meet the detailed description, as given on the plans and as described herein. Where discrepancies exist between Standards & Guidelines referenced within these specifications and the Landscape Manual of the applicable jurisdiction, the latter takes precedence.
- 2. All plant material, unless otherwise specified, that is not nursery grown, uniformly branched, does not have a viaorous root system, and does not conform to the most recent edition of the American Association of Nurserymen (AAN) Standards will be rejected. Plant material that is not healthy, vigorous, free from defects, decay, disfiguring roots, sunscald injuries, abrasions of the bark, plant disease, insect pest eags, borers and all forms of insect infestations or objectionable disfigurements will be rejected. Plant material that is weak or which has been cut back from larger grades to meet specified requirements will be rejected. Trees with forked leaders will be rejected. All B & B plants shall be freshly dug; no healed-in plants or plants from cold storage will be accepted.
- 3. Unless otherwise specified, all general conditions, planting operations, details and planting specifications shall conform to the most recent edition of the "Landscape Specification Guidelines by the Landscape Contractors Association of MD, DC, & VA", (hereinafter "Landscape Guidelines") approved by the Landscape Contractors Association of Metropolitan Washington and the Potomac Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects.
- 4. Contractor shall guarantee all plant material for a period of one year after date of acceptance in accordance with the appropriate section on the Landscape Guidelines. Contractor's attention is directed to the maintenance requirements found within the one year specifications including watering and replacement of specified plant material.
- 5. Contractor shall be responsible for notifying all relevant and appropriate utility companies, utility contractors, and "Miss Utility" a minimum of 48 hours prior to the beginning of any work. Contractor may make minor adjustments in spacing and location of plant material to avoid conflicts with utilities. Major changes will require the approval of the landscape architect. Damage to existing structure and utilities shall be repaired at the expense of the Contractor.
- 6. Protection of existing vegetation to remain shall be accomplished via the temporary installation of 4 foot high snow fence at the drip line, see detail.
- 7. Contractor is responsible for installing all material in the proper planting season for each plant type. All planting is to be completed within growing season of completion of site construction. Do not plant Pinus strobus or XCupressacyparis leylandii between November 15 and March 15. Landscape plants are not to be installed before site is graded to final grade.
- 8. Contractor to regrade, fine grade, sod, hydroseed and straw mulch all areas disturbed by their work.
- 9. Bid shall be based on actual site conditions. No extra payment shall be made for work arising from actual site conditions differing from those indicated on drawings and specifications.
- 10. Plant quantities are provided for the convenience of the contractor only. If discrepancies exist between quantities shown on plan and those shown on the plant list, the quantities on the plan take precedence. Where discrepancies on the plan exist between the symbols and the callout leader. the number of symbols take precedence.
- 11. All shrubs and aroundcover areas shall be planted in continuous planting beds, prepared as specified, unless otherwise indicated on plans. (See Specification 13). Beds to be mulched with minimum 2" and maximum 3" of composted, double-shredded hardwood mulch throughout.
- 12. Positive drainage shall be maintained on planting beds (minimum 2 percent slope).
- 13. Bed preparation shall be as follows: Till into a minimum depth of 6" 1 yard of Compro or Leafaro per 200 SF of planting bed, and 1 yard of topsoil per 100 SF of bed. Add 3 lbs of standard 5-10-5 fertilizer per cubic yard of planting mix and till. Ericaceous plants (Azaleas, Rhododendrons, etc.): top dress after planting with iron sulfate or comparable product according to package directions. Taxus baccata 'Repandens' (English weeping yews): Top dress after planting with 1/4 to 1/2 cup lime each.
- 14. Planting mix: For trees not in a prepared bed, mix 50% Compro or Leafgro with 50% soil from tree hole to use as backfill, see tree planting detail.
- 15. Weed & insect control: Incorporate a pre-emergent herbicide into the planting bed following recommended rates on the label. For tree planting, apply a pre-emergent on top of soil and root ball before mulching. Caution: For areas to be planted with a ground cover, be sure to carefully check the chemical used to assure its adaptability to the specific groundcover to be treated. Maintain the mulch weed-free for the extent of the warranty period. Under no circumstances is a pesticide containing chlorpyrifos to be used as a means of pest control.
- 16. Water: All plant material planted shall be watered thoroughly the day of planting. All plant material not vet planted shall be properly protected from drying out until planted. At a minimum, water unplanted plant material daily and as necessary to avoid dessication.
- 17. Pruning: Do not heavily prune trees and shrubs at planting. Prune only broken, dead, or diseased branches.






DECIDUOUS B&B TREE PLANTING DETAIL (TREES 3" CAL. OR SMALLER)








<u>Mulches</u>: See Section B-4-2 Soil Preparation, Topsoiling, and Soil Amendments, Section B-4-3 Seeding and Mulching, and Section B-4-4 Temporary Stabilization. Mulch must be anchored to

<u>Tillage</u>: Till to rougher surface and bring clods to the surface. Begin plowing on windward side of site. Chisel-type plows spaced about 12 inches apart, spring-toothed harrows, and similar plows are examples of equipment that may produce the desired effect.


EXISTING PARKING LAYOUT 1" = 10'-0"


