**Description:**

This house faces southwest toward Waterloo Road. It is a one-story, three-bay by two-bay frame structure on a parged foundation, with aluminum siding and a gable roof of asphalt shingles with a northwest-southeast ridge. There is a three-bay by one-bay, one-story shed-roofed addition on the northeast. It also has a parged foundation, and the roof cantilevers on the northeast several feet. There is a CMU chimney in the center of the ridge. All of the openings are boarded over.

**Significance:**

The house at 5513 Waterloo Road is a Cape Cod at its most elemental. This housing type became very popular after World War II for lower-middle class housing. This house sits very close to Jonestown, an historically African-American settlement, and may have been part of the linear development along Waterloo Road. Much of Jonestown has been obliterated by road improvements and the Route 100-Route 108 interchange, and this house is scheduled to be demolished in late 2009 or early 2010 as part of the continuing development of Howard County.

The house at 5513 Waterloo Road, at the northeast corner of Falls Run Road in eastern Howard County, Maryland, faces southwest toward Waterloo Road. It is a one-story, three-bay by two-bay frame structure on a parged foundation, with aluminum siding and a gable roof of asphalt shingles with a northwest-southeast ridge. There is a three-bay by one-bay, one-story shed-roofed addition on the northeast. It also has a parged foundation, and the roof cantilevers on the northeast several feet. There is a CMU chimney in the center of the ridge. All of the openings are boarded over.

The southwest elevation has a doorway in the center, with a large picture-window opening in the west bay that has a brick sill. A standard-sized window is in the south bay. There is a shed-roofed porch that is several feet short of each end wall, and it has a concrete deck and three square wood posts. The southeast elevation has two standard-sized windows on the first story, with a narrow opening in the foundation and a small louvered vent in the gable end. The addition has no opening. The northeast elevation has a doorway set east of center, with a standard-sized window in each end bay. There is a modern wood deck attached here. The northwest elevation has a standard-sized window in the addition and two in the main block, with two small openings in the foundation and a small louvered vent in the gable end.


