Ho-102 Sarah Jane Powell Log Cabin Cooksville Private

circa 1859

This log cabin faces east on the west side of Route 97 and was built from trees found on the property by the Thomas Hood family for Sarah Jane Powell Dorsey, "late their slave for her unwavering fidelity and general moral worth as a servant."

It is a three bay wide, one room deep, one and a half story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log cabin. Its wide exterior stone chimney rests in the center of its north wall, topped by a tall, square brick chimney.

A one story high, shed roofed, one bay wide, frame addition runs along the entire west elevation.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Sarah Jane Powell Log Cabin is located on the west side of Route 97 about one half mile south of the interchange with Route 144. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, one and a half story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log cabin. A wide exterior stone chimney rests in the center of the north wall and is topped by a tall, square brick chimney. This elevation hold no window openings.

The cabin faces east and holds a central battan wood door constructed of planks sawn from Walnut trees on the property. Mount Gregory Methodist Church came off the same land belonging to Thomas Hood of Lisbon. Rectangular, double-hung windows rest on each side of the doorway, that on the north holds six-over-six lights and that on the south holds two-over-two lights. Above rest smaller second floor windows with one-over-one lights.

The south elevation holds only one window, a double-hung attic window with two-over-two lights. A cellar door with a wooden cover is located on this elevation.

Along the entire west elevation lies a one story high, shed roofed, one bay wide, frame addition which holds two rectangular, double-hung windows with six-over-six lights in the west wall, a rectangular entrance in the south wall and a rectangular, double-hung window to the west of a tall, square, brick covered with cement chimney on the north wall. A single small second floor window rests in the north bay of the west wall, holding one-over-two lights.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Sarah Jane Powell was set free by Thomas Hood and given this piece of property on which this house was built and given to her around the year 1850. It was constructed of materials found on the property.

Thomas Hood was one of the first three County Commissioners for Howard County in 1851, and owned large tracts of land in the vicinity of Lisbon, Cooksville and Sykesville.

Sarah Jane Powell was born in Lisbon in 1828. Her sisters and brothers were all sold to plantations near New Orleans, Louisiana. She married Alfred Dorsey. They made their home here, raising four sons and two daughters. A notation in an old family bible indicates their son Joseph Dorsey was born here in 1865. Joseph and his two brothers Albert and Tob all settled on adjoining land.

Ella Dorsey, one of the two girls born here in the cabin married George Berry and moved to Baltimore. She was Mr. Albert France's grandmother and lived in a large house on Gilmore Street in Baltimore. She, like her mother had a very pleasant face, and was a loveable, well-settled kind of person. White or colored - all stopped to see her as they did her mother Sarah Jane. Ella and George had four children. He died and Ella remarried and had four more children. Ella and Jennie were sisters. Ella's daughter Sarah Jane Berry was born in Baltimore on May 25, 1893 and married Louis W. France (b. September 6, 1890) on May 18, 1911.

Sarah Jane and Louis France had the following children: Evelyn E. France, April 15, 1911; James Louis France, November 24, 1912; Eva V. France - August 10, 1914; and Albert E. France, January 5, 1917.

These four children made the fourth generation stemming from Sarah Jane Powell Dorsey. Evelyn was the only one to have children and had two daughters Veronica (b. August 8, 1934) and Ramona Johnson Hall. (January 16, 1938) Veronica married Paul Stanton and had one son, Van L. Stanton and one daughter Jan L. Stanton, born on July 15, 1955. (6th generation). Jan Stanton married Larry Marshall on August 24, 1974. They have a daughter born on September 30, 1975, named Yonnette. Yonnette who visited the old log cabin on her mother's birthday makes the seventh generation.

Ramona Johnson Hall had four daughters and two sons. They are Moneves va Duncan Hall, Deborah R. Hall, Jasamine Hall, Shelby Angel Hall, James A.

Hall III and Careous Hall.

Jasamine Hall has a five year old Daughter, Jacinta P. Kælly who also is a seventh generation member of Sarah Jane Powell Dorsey's family.

Sarah Jane Powell Dorsey is buried in Bushy Park's Joshua Cemetery. Her little granddaughter Josephine, is buried in a small graveyard just south of the log cabin. Her tombstone reads:

Born August 16, 1885 Dies October 12, 1886 Age 1 year 1 month and 26 days

Little Fennie was a darling pride of all our hearts at home. I loved her oh perhaps too well for soon she slept and died. How much she suffered there's none can tell but God come and took the sufferer home.

The property of this little log cabin is still surrounded by adjoining family members. On its north side is Eugene Dorsey, Sarah Jane Dorsey's grandson; on the west side her granddaughter Katie S. Miles; on the south about 3/10 mile west on Miller's Mill Road live Hallie and Thany Dorsey, daughters of Sarah's son Albert.

Mr. Albert France related that Sarah Jane Powell was set free by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Hood before the 1860's. On the fourth of May in 1869, Sarah Hood, J. Eugene Buck and Josephine Buck, his wife, of Howard County in the state of Maryland deeded the present property to Sarah Jane Powell Dorsey. The deed reads as follows:

. . . Whereas the said Sarah Hood desires to manifest her regard for Sarah Jane Dorsey, colored, late her slave for the unwavering fidelity and general moral worth as a servant and for that purpose has purchased from the above named J. Eugene Buck and paid him for the following described lot of land which she designs as a gift to the said Sarah Jane Dorsey. Now therefore . . . J. Eugene Buck, et al. do grant unto the said Sarah Jane Dorsey and her children in fee simple, all that parcel of land lying in Howard County, aforesaid, on the west side of the Washington Road, called "Poverty Discovered" which is contained within the following metes and bounds . . .

As an example of an early log cabin owned by a freed black woman, this structure has outstanding significance in the black history of Howard County and as such should be placed on the National Register of Historic Places. Her association with the Hood family, early settlers and leaders of Howard County gives added authority to her home's historic significanance.




