This log building faces west on the east side of St. Michael's Road at its intersection with Florence Road. It features a central east and west entrance with small six over-three light window north of the west entrance. The building has settled so that only half of the east entrance is seen.

Built by the Bowman family, it was later used by the Pickett family who raised a family of five or six children in this log building. As they prospered a frame house was constructed north of the log house.

This new house of the late nineteeth century saw additions in the first decade of the twentieth so that it stands today as a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-scuth) frame house with two story high, intersecting gable roof (running east-west) Kitchen wing off the east wall of the house.

A large 1903 barn, resting on a stone foundation, lies on the west side of St. Michael's Road with a century old log tobacco shed encased within an auxiliary farm building.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Charles Layton, Jr. Log Building faces west on the east side of St. Michaels' Road at its intersection with Florence Road. Originally used as a residence, it was later used for a summer kitchen and presently is used for storage and is in fair to deteriorated condition.

It is a single room with loft above, gabled roof (running north-south) early nine-teenth century log structure. Its west elevation features a central batten wood door to whose northside rests a single, rectangular window with two-over-three lights which was originally a six-over-three light window. The hand hewn logs are overlaid at the corners and are filled with a composition of stone and mortar.

The building has settled considerably on the east elevation where a central entrance is only half exposed. A wood shed off its north wall connects the log building to a batten wood, one story high, gabled roof (running east-west) structure. A central loft window with no sash is placed on the south elevation.

North of the log building lies the house, built after the log cabin, sometime in the late nineteenth century. Initially it consisted of one room with second floor above. A living room was added to its north wall and a kitchen off the east wall of the living room some seventy years ago, circa 1910.

Today the house faces west and is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame structure with square brick chimney rising from the north wall of its original room, between the south and central bays. A two story high, two bay wide, one room deep, intersecting gable roof (running east-west) frame kitchen wing forms an "L" off the central andnorth bay of the buildings east wall. A square brick chimney is inset into the kitchen's east wall whose north and south walls hold rectangular entrances; that on the north is covered by a gabled roof portico: that on the south by a small second floor porch, linking a shed roofed addition to the south wall of the kitchen wing, whose north elevation holds a first and second floor six-over-six light window with four light attic casement window above.

The south elevation of the original part of the house holds a first and second floor, two-over-two light window with four light attic casement window above and a cellar door inset into the stone foundation. Along the entire west elevation of the house is a one story high, shed roofed, open porch, supported by four square posts to which three wide steps lead.

Northwest of the house on the west side of St. Michael's Road lies a large two story high frame barn, resting on a stone foundation. Just north east of the barn, on the same side of the road, is a century old log tobacco shed, from whose center grows a and around which has been constructed an auxilary frame building, resting on a stone foundation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Charles Layton, Jr. Log Building is significant architecturally and historically to Howard County and the state of Maryland.

Architecturally it is noteworthy as an example of a log dwelling house of the early nineteenth century which was inhabited by families who raised as many as five and six children here. The rough hewn oak and chestnut logs were formed by hand and overlaid at the corners. Stones and a dried mud-like mortar form the chinking between the logs. Though the building has settled to such an extent that its central east door is only half evident, the building is not beyond repair and is still in use for storage.

The wide random width boards which form the lofts' floor can be seen as well as the rough hewn ceiling joists. The building has a central west entrance with two-over-three light window, which originally held six-over-three lights.

The work done in restoring old log buildings by several Howard Countians insures the feasibility of the restoration of this log dwelling house, whose association with the Pickett and Bowman families of Howard County give it historical as well as architectural signifigance.

Not only the log house, but the adjoining residence of Mr. Layton, a late nineteenth century house with later additions, and the large frame barn built on a stone foundation and the century old tobacco barn encased within an auxiliary building north east of the barn should be included in any recommendation for inclusion to the National Register of Historic Places.




