Thaddeus Crapster's Log House faces west on the east side of Route 94, five miles south of Route 144 at Lisbon. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, one and a half story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log house, resting on a stone foundation with a central ~~corner~~ window inset into the roof line over the rectangular paneled door on the west elevation. Single rectangular, six-over-six light windows flank this entrance which is covered by a gabled roof portico supported by two log columns.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Thaddeus Crapster Log House faces west on the east side of Route 94, five miles south of Route 144 at Lisbon. It sits back from the road some two tenths of a mile behind a large corn field, with woods on its south and east. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, one and a half story high gabled roof (running north-south) log house, set on a stone foundation with a central dormer window holding a rectangular, double hung window with six-over-six lights, on its west elevation.

A central rectangular, paneled west entrance is flanked by rectangular double-hung windows with six-over-six lights and covered by a gabled, shake roof, portico held by two log beams.

The north elevation holds a wooden rectangular entrance door with square windows above. The rectangular north entrance is located east of center, while the gable roof on this elevation is entirely composed of rectangular and triangular glass panels, two of which are small square sliding, windows. A small brick patio is located on this elevation. The east elevation holds a first floor window on the north side and a central cellar door.

The south elevation features a rectangular six-over-six light central first floor window and a double window above inset into a shingled A frame.

This entire building has been completely restored and renovated and is now composed of one large room downstairs whose south wall contains a modern kitchen area. A bed room lies above. The hand hewn, log beams have been exposed on both the interior and exterior of the house. This exposure creates a charming interior. The underside of the main joists of the house are covered with bark while the facing side is smooth. An interlocking dovetail was used to join the logs, which were put together with no nails. This log house is an outstanding example of restoration and how such work creates a charming unique residence as well as the preservation of a local historic land mark.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Thaddeus Crapster Log House is significant architecturally and historically.

Architecturally it is noteworthy as a well-constructed log house, which has just been restored by its present owners, Mr. and Mrs. James Heckman. Both the interior and exterior facing of the hand hewn logs have been exposed and new plaster has covered the stone and mud like filling used as chinking between the logs on both the exterior and interior. Modern plumbing has been installed where only a sink once stood.

According to local residents of this area this log cabin stood long before it was used by Thaddeus Crapster as his home from the late nineteenth century well into the twentieth. He was notable as a local historian who delighted in writing down his findings. He collected antiques as well. His papers and house were ransacked by vandals and much of his research disorganized. These papers are now in the hands of his daughter Mary of Baltimore, Maryland.

Noteworthy as part of a large land grant called "Big Meadow" once belonging to the Ellicott House on Route 94, now known as Rockland Farm, this old log house should be placed on the Natural Register of Historic Places as a fine example of a log dwelling used today as a modern private residence.

The log dwelling of Thaddens Crayster sits some distance E. of Road on a large expanse of tiled acreage.

Of one and one half storey height the building possesses an A frame roof the ridge of which runs north to south. At the W. elevation is a centered door flanked by a single window to each side. Directly above the door is a single peaked dormer.

There is an exterior chimney at the N.E. end and a small A roofed farm porch shelters the front door.

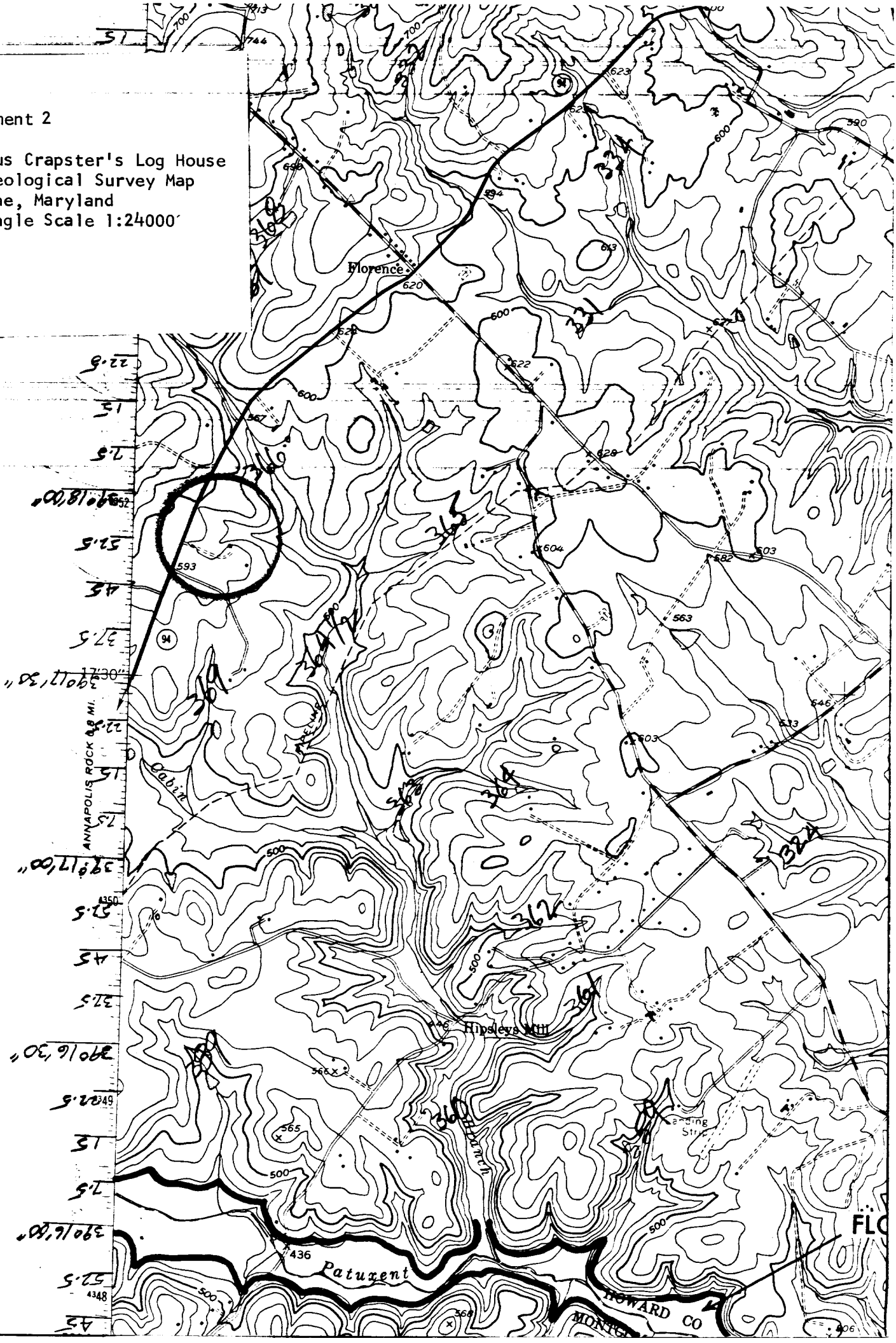

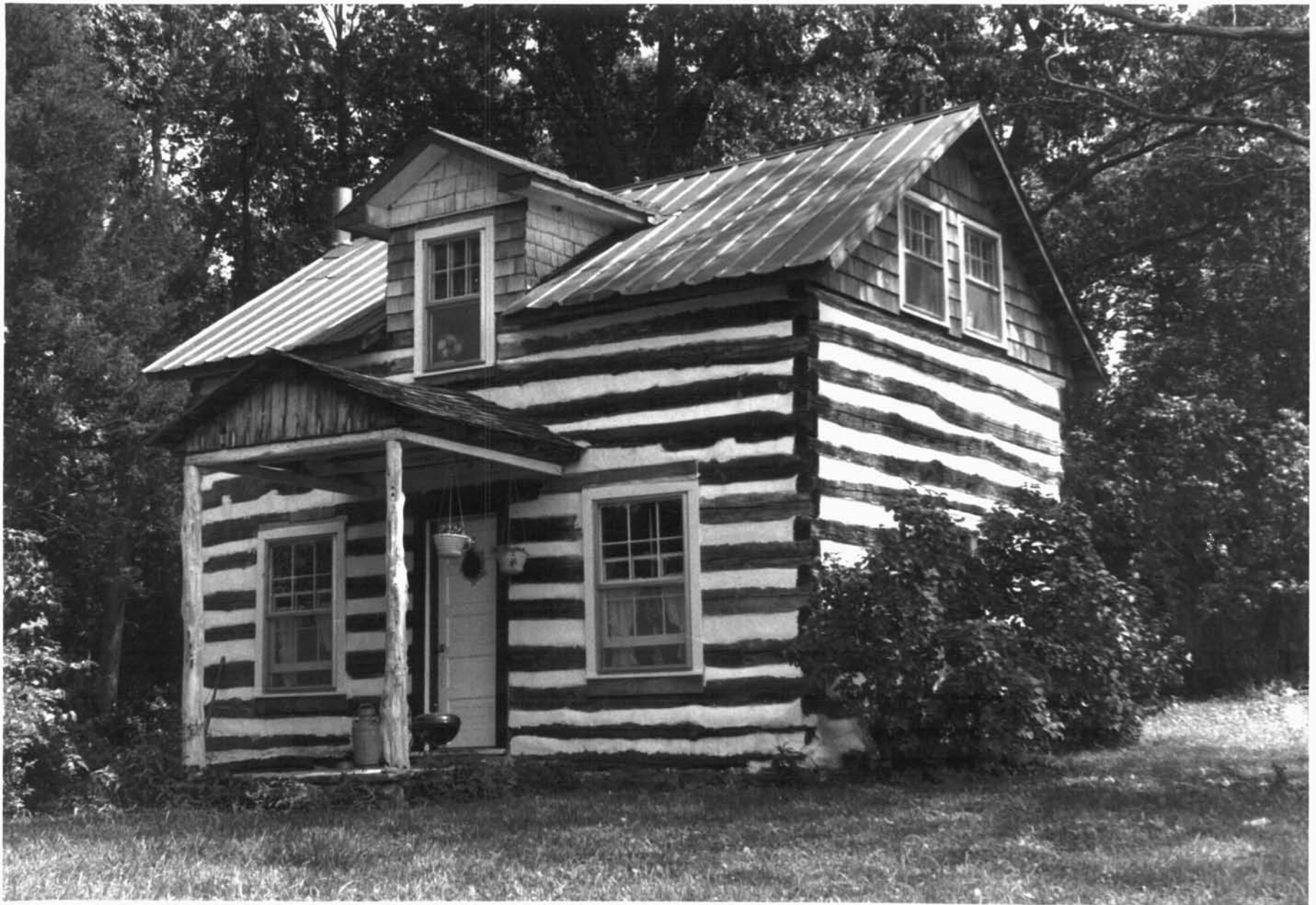
