ADDENDA

I met with Clifford A. Denney, Park Manager of the Patuxent River/Seneca Creek State Parks, about the properties on the inventory list within his jurisdiction.

He informed me that the George G. Willson Log House was destroyed in a fire set by an arson during the fall of either 1981 or 1982. I visited the site of the house which has been filled in and contains practically no remains of the house.

Late nineteenth century

The George Willson Log House faces east on the south side of Annapolis Rock Road, a short distance west of its intersection with Hipsley Mill Road.

It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log house, resting on a stone foundation, from whose gable roof rises a square brick chimney between the central and north bays of the house.

Presently a part of the Patuxent State Park, this abandoned log house waits for rehabilitation and reuse.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The George Willson Log House faces south on the west side of Annapolis Rock Road, a short distancementh of its intersection with Hipsley Mill Road.

It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running eastwest) log house, covered in some sections with clapboard, resting on a stone foundation from whose gabled roof rises a square brick chimney between the central and east bays of the house.

The south elevation features a central rectangular portal flanked by rectangular windows with three second floor vertically aligned windows above.

The north elevation holds a double window on the west bay and a door in the east bay with two second floor windows above, while a first floor window is placed on the east wall and no apertures on the west wall.

The building is in a dilapidated state of disrepair with no sashes in its window openings, no doors and much of its original log construction exposed. The interior central staircase appears stable structurally and the square brick chimney with stove pipe outlet indicates a late nineteenth century or early twentieth century building date.

Though in a dilapidated state, the building is not beyond repair and appears structurally sound. Presently in an abandoned state and owned by the Patuxent State Park, its potential for reuse and rehabilitation is limitless.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The George Wilson Log House is architecturally and historically significant to Howard County. Architecturally it is representative of Howard County's late nineteenth century log houses. Historically it is located on what was once a part of the Ellicott House property, called Big Meadow. It was last occupied circa 1950 by the family of Lee Sirk, owner of Lee's Market in nearby Lisbon, and since that time has been abandoned.

Owned by the Patuxent State Park its potential for rehabilitation and reuse appears limitless, though no plans are presently known for the building.




