The Heritage Log Building faces east on the north side of Mullinex Road just west of its intersection with Duval Road. It is a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log house with a three bay wide, cone room deep, two story high, intersecting gable roof (running east-west) frame building extending west from the log building's west wall.

Notable as a part of the Heritage, home of J.D.Warfield and his son Bernard, it may well antedate the 1812 main building.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Heritage Log House faces east on the north side of Mullinix Road, just west of its intersection with Duval Road. It is a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log house with a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, intersecting gabled roof (running east-west) frame building extending west from the log building's west wall. Their south walls lie flush with one another. The rough hewn logs of the building are overlaid at the corners. Its east wall features a wide carriage entrance in its north bay and a rectangular window in its south bay. Two second floor rectangular windows (previously boarded up but now open) rest above. A batten wood casement door-window is centered into the south wall with a rectangular window above covered by a batten wood door. A first and second floor open rectangular window is located in the north bay of the log house's west wall.

Though vacant and unoccupied, the building stands erect and tall with its rough hewn logs strongly separated by chinking almost entirely covered with plaster presenting a very firm composition. The frame building addition appears to be in a more dilapidated state, though not beyond repair.

The south wall of this latter wing holds a central rectangular, paneled entrance, flanked by rectangular windows once holding double-hung sashes with two-over-two lights, which have almost entirely disappeared. Two vertically aligned second floor rectangular windows rest above.

On the north wall of the addition is seen only a four light attic casement window, while the east wall of the house is similar to its west wall with one exception; the central bay holds a window on the first floor and the entrance is placed in the south bay.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Heritage Log Building is significant to Howard County historically by its association with the Warfield family of Cherry Gnove and the Heritage, once known as Locust Grove and architecturally as a fine example of a log building of the early nineteenth century.

The Warfield family of Cherry Grove were early settlers to this section of Howard County, serving honorably in both the Revoluntionary War and in the War of 1812. Philemon Dorsey Warfield entered the war of 1812 and built his brick house during this period.

The log building north of the house is believed to have stood at that time and be that mentioned in J.P. Warfield's history of Howard County, entitled Founders of Anne Arundel and Howard Counties Maryland. He states that Philemon built his brick house, then called Locust Grove, near the log cabin of this pioneer outpost, the restern part of "Ridgely's Great Range."

In more recent times, the log building was used as a doctor's office for the son of J.D. Warfield, whose other son, Bernard Warfield, inherited the farm. The adjoining frame wing of the house was used as the doctors residence. Mrs. Jean Warfield Culwell of Mt. Airy, daughter of Mr. Bernard Warfield remembers visiting her uncle and delighting in his doctor's office.

It is now abandoned and falling into a state of disrepair. It has just recently been acquired by Mr. Donald Warfield, son of Bernard Warfield, son of J. D. Warfield, who is totally renovating the old 1812 brick residence.

Of exceptional historical and architectural merit, the Heritage Log Building should be placed on the National Register of Historic Places and any future local landmark ordinance, should its owners so desire.




