Deep Meadow is a simple country farm house believed to have been constructed as two homes which compose an L plan. It appears on the Hopkins Atlas of 1878 as the property of John Quick but its interior woodwork and stone foundation with log supporting beams bespeak an earlier date.

A two bay wide, one room deep, two story gable roofed early structure now facing west originally faced south while a later three bay wide, two bay deep two story gabled roof structure faces south.

Stone chimneys are placed on the north wall of the original kitchen wing and on the east wall of the addition. A one story shed roofed porch runs along the south elevation of the addition supported by six wooden posts. Lying on the west wall of this second structure is a one story high library addition two bays wide and one room deep with exposed brick chimney on its west wall.

Restoration of and addition to this simple farm house have been carried out sensitively and tastefully by the present owners Mrs. Margaret and Mr. David Zeeveld under the guidance of Mr. John Poe Tyler of the architectural firm of Tyler, Chalfant and McShane.

A restored peg barn lies north of the main house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Deep Meadow is a simple country farm house which has been fortunate in having owners with taste and sensitivity who have restored it and added in 1970 a comfortable library wing.

It is noted on the Hopkins Atlas of 1878 for Howard County as the property of John Quick, consisting of 104.5 acres.

Restoration work has been carried on by Mr. John Poe Tyler, architect of the Baltimore architectural firm of Tyler, Chalfant & McShane who believes the building was constructed as two homes. Another architect, Mr. Gordon Kennedy, friend of the family, believes the kitchen wing to have been constructed circa 1820. The wide stone chimney which lies on the north wall of the kitchen goes down to the basement and may have been used at the time for cooking or for curing meat.

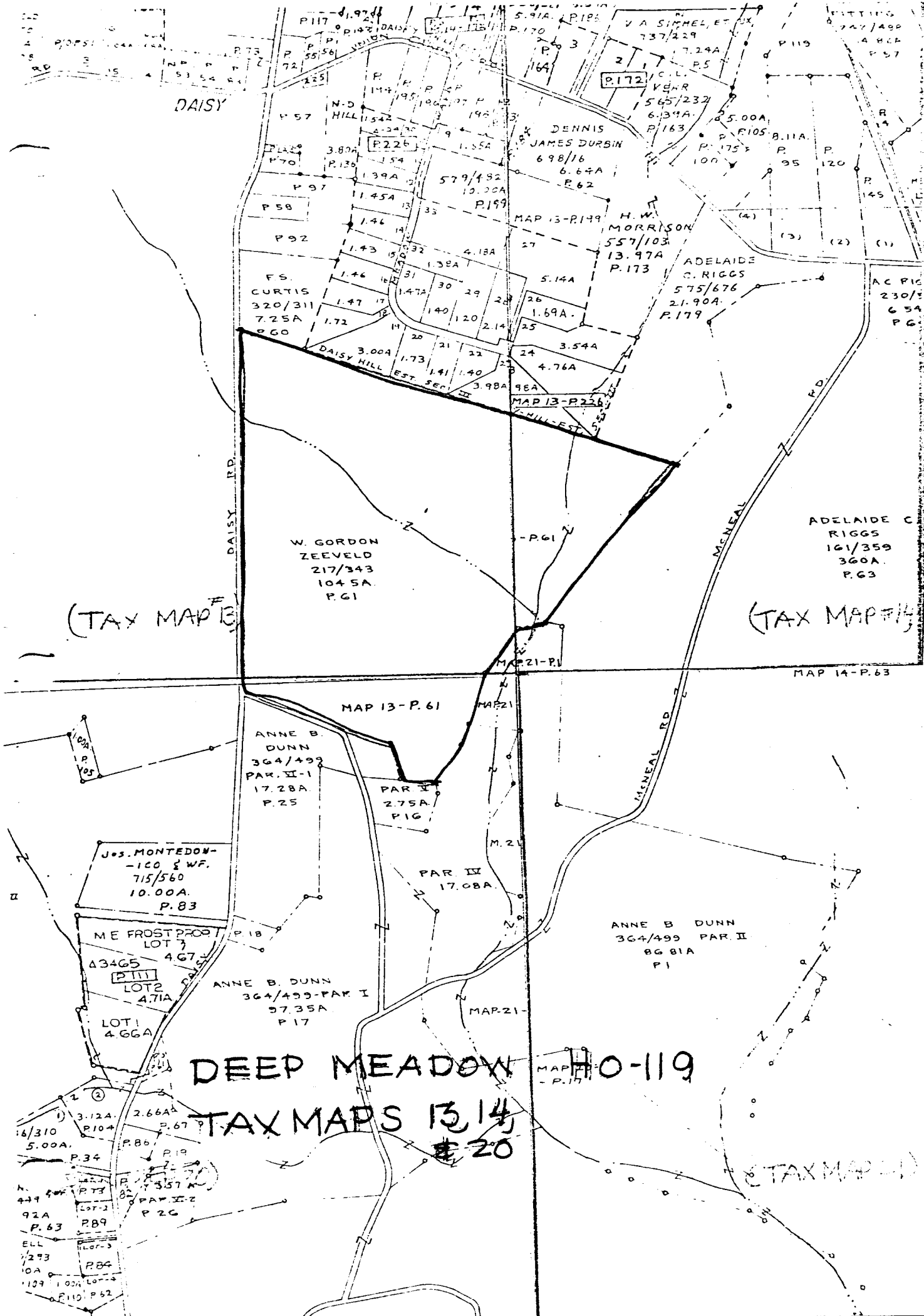
Deep Meadows real significance is due to the care and thought which has gone into a relatively modest farm house, creating a comfortable and tastefully executed exterior and interior plan which has adhered strictly to the original features and character of the house.
