Ho-164 Clifton/Welling's Stone House 1818 Clarksville Private

Located on a tract of land called "White Wine and Claret" patented in 1712 by the Honourable John Dorsey of Troy Hill, Clifton is a three bay wide, one room deep, two and a half story, gabled roof (running east - west) stone house with twin gabled roof dormer windows facing south, and brick chimneys set into its east and west walls. An inscription is found on its west wall of 1818. The building features rectangular south entrances, surmounted by three lite transoms in its central bay, fine stone quoining and flat arched stretcher stone lintels. A one story hipped roof porch supported by posts held by scrolled brackets runs along the south elevation while a one bay wide, two story high, shed roofed frame additon runs along its north wall, holding the staircase and hall of the main house which is connected by the hall to a two bay wide, one room deep, one and a half story high stone kitchen wing whose gabled roof runs north - south with wide stone chimney inset into its north wall. Shed roofed frame additions are located on each side of this kitchen wing.

Owned by several generations of the Welling family of "White Wine and Claret", Clifton is one of Howard Counties most interesting homes.

### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

White Wine and Claret is located on Route 32 just north of Pindell School Rd. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two and a half story, stone, gabled roof (running east-west) structure with brick chimneys inset into its east and west walls. It bears the date of 1818 on a stone blate on the west wall below the brick chimeny. It is inscribed  $W^- + W^2$ , standing for William Welling 1818. Two gabled roof dormer windows rest in the roof of the south elevation, holding double-hung windows with six - over - six lights.

The 1818 Welling stone house features stone quoining and ashlar stone, flat arched lintels. A rectangular basement door, added in 1973, rests in the west bay of the south wall. A stone kitchen wing, two bays wide, one room deep and one and a half stories high has a gabled roof (running north - south) with two gabled roof dormer windows on the west elevation. A wide brick chimney is inset into its north wall. Its rectangular west entrance door is located in the south bay, surmounted by a two light transom. A rectangular, double-hung window with six - over - six lights rests in the north bay. The fenestration for the main house built in 1818 is rectangular, double - hung with six - over - six lights, decorated with wooden sills and strectcher stone flat - arched lintels.

A one story, open, hipped roof porch, supported by four columns with scrolled brackets runs along the south elevation. Double entrance doors with three light transoms surmounted by flat arched stone lintels take in the central bay of the first floor south wall. Six wooden steps, lead to the porch and entrances.

A two story high, shed roofed one bay wide frame addition running along the north wall of the stone house creates a hall and staircase. A one story high shed roofed enclosed frame addition lies along almost the entire west elevation of the old house and hall. Six wooden steps lead to a rectangular entrance on its north wall. The entry wall south of the original west entrance and leading into the hall was enclosed and made into a bath by Mr.& Mrs. Beaver, present occupants circa 1964.

A three bay wide, shed roofed frame addition on the east wall of the kitchen wing drops from the apex of that wing's gabled roof line. Originally it may have been an open porch. Later it was used as a dining room with two double - hung windows on its east wall. It is now a first floor bearoom. A wide stone exterior chimney is on its north wall. The roof line continues to slope downward creating a one story high open porch which was enclosed by Mr. and Mrs. George Beaver in 1975. A rectangular four lite door is located in the east bay of its north wall with a rectangular double-hung window with six - over - six lights in the west bay. Three rectangular, double hung windows holding varying lights rest in the east wall of this enclosure.

Mr. and Mrs Beaver in 1975 also added a rectangular cellar door CONTINUE ON SEPARATE SHEET IF NECESSARY

in the west bay of the south wall.

The interior features original randam width oak floors in the dining and living room as well as original wood work. The interior hall teatures a fine staircase with wooden bannister and spindels.

Barns lie east of the house which is surrounded by corn fields. The house is 0.1 mile north of Route 32 located on gently sloping farm land. Ruins of an old stone chimney lie west of the house in the woods.

East of the house and barns is located a free parking area for trailers of Columbia residents.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
The Welling House, once known as "Clifton" is a part of the tract known as "White Wine and Claret" patented in 1712 by the Honourable John Dorsey of Troy Hill for his daughter Deborrah Dorsey Ridgely and her two sons.

Joshua Warfield relates a bit of Welling family history in speaking of William Welling, brother of Major Henry in the following paragraph:

From William Welling, brother of Major Henry, descends the Welling family of "White Wine and Claret". He had two sons, Henry and William. Henry's only daughter is Mrs. Kate Watkins, widow of Thomas Watkins (of Dr. William). Mr. Trueman Welling, upon the old homestead, and Mrs. Henry Forsythe, are heirs of William Welling, Jr.

Trueman's son, Clinton E. Welling was born on the place as was his daughter, Luoy Welling, now Mrs. James Boss of Laurel, Maryland. A Mr. William WElling of West Friendship, had grandparents here.

A ccording to Mr. Harwood Owings, Sr., the great tall stone on the west side of Ball Shop Road where there is a very well angled turn was one of the boundary stones for White Wine and Claret. When the tract was surveyed it was a wintry day and after looking at the finished plat, Mr. John Dorsey remarked that the men must have drunk too much White Wine and Claret", thus the name of the tract.

The Hopkins Atlas of 1878 indicates that Mr. Willaim Welling live here at that time.

The date of 1818 on a stone plate on the west wall below the brick chimney offers the date of construction. It is believed by family members that the kitchen wing was constructed at the same time as well as the hall. This is possible and no proof to the contrary has been uncovered. It is possible that a breezeway originally existed between the kitchen and main house which later became the present hall.

Due to the interesting stone architecture with its double doors entering into a double living room and its historical association with the Welling family of "White Wine and Claret", "Clifton" should be






