The Owing's Log-Brick House faces south on the north side of Route 144, two houses west of the Old Presbyterian Manse.

An interesting architectural complex, it began in the early nineteenth century as a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) brick house to which was added a three bay wide, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log addition off its north wall. Sometime in the 1860's a three bay wide, one room deep, two & a half story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame extension was constructed off its east wall, which featured a central hall and staircase and intersecting central gable holding a roman arched, double hung window with two-over-two lights. Further additions were made to the house in the late nineteenth century when a two story high bay window was added to the west side of the brick section's south facade.

Fenestration is proportionally scaled and vertically aligned throughout the house which features two original mantle pieces. A brick chimney which was inset into the west wall of the east room addition has been removed for protection against fire by Mr. and Mrs. Mayne who have totally renovated this charming old house.

Notable historically in 1825 when Mr. Ringgold brought out three chairs for General Lafayette as he traveled along this route, it was later owned by Hammond Welsh and Basil Owings as well as other prominent Lisbon families.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Mayne House faces south on the north side of Route 144, three houses east of its intersection with Route 94.

It has been constructed in three sections, 1) a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) brick house 2) a three bay wide, one room deep, gabled roof (running north-south) log structure and 3) a three bay wide, one room deep, two and a half story high gabled roof (running east-west) frame addition to the east wall of the brick house. The entire house is now covered with stucco.

This latter addition features a central "A" framed dormer window which holds a roman arched, double-hung window. The west bay of this section holds the rectangular, cross paneled entrance door, which is flanked by five side lights and surmounted by a four light transom. The door enters into what is now a central hall, featuring a fine staircase with scrolled spindles. This section of the house features double hung, vertically aligned, proportionally scaled fenestration. The windows hold one-over-one lights. The two east bays of this section hold one large first and second floor room, featuring wide, random width pine floors. A wide brick chimney on the west wall of this room was taken out due to previous fires in the chimney.

The mantlepice was retained and features a curvilinear pattern on its architrave. The woodwork in this room features medalions in each corner of the door frame's lintel, another feature of the 1860's. The east elevation of this section of the house holds a double-hung, stylistic gothic cut, two-over-two light window. This along with the roman arched dormer window, the curvilinear mantle piece and the carved spindles date this section of the house to circa 1860.

The brick section of the house, lying on the west side of the now central hall features a much simpler mantlepice on its east wall. It has been embellished by the later addition (probably circa 1890) of a conical roofed, two story high bay window on the west bay of its south facade. Three first and second floor, double-hung windows, holding one-over-one lights comprise the bay, with each of its three sides holding one window. This two story high brick section is believed to have been built first and then the three bay wide, two story high log extension off its north wall second. This is due to two facts: 1) The floor in the second floor bedroom in front of the center of its north wall was weaker than the rest of the floor when restoration by Mr. Mayne was undertaken. Mr. and Mrs. Mayne believe that some sort of staircase was originally located here. 2) A window in the east bay of the north wall was exposed which looked on to the back staircase of the log addition. This was covered by Mr. Mayne in his restoration and the staircase wall papered by Mrs. Mayne.

These two facts, however, have led Mr. and Mrs. Mayne to the conclusion that the brick house came first and then the log addition sometime in the early eighteen hundreds. Circa 1860 the central hall and the east section was constructed, with the 1890's bringing in the two story high, conical roofed bay window.

The building's exterior facade is complex and eclectic in style with a very simple, direct and workable interior plan. The building is in excellent condition.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

The Owings Log-Brick House is significant architecturally and historically.

Architecturally it is a fascinating building which began as a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) brick structure to whose north wall was added a three bay wide, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) log house. Sometime in the mid to late nineteenth century a two story high, three bay wide, central hall - east room addition was added on the east wall of the brick house, featuring an intersecting central gable with romanesque double-hung window, holding two-over-two lights.

It is very probable that both the brick and log sections of the house were completed by 1837 when the house was sold by the heirs of Hammond Welsh, son of John Welsh IV, one of the settlers of nearby Florence.

Interestingly enough, the brick house was constructed prior to the log section.

The house is truly eclectic in character and representative of how buildings grew to completion over the years, initiating as simply designed homes and later embellished with stylistic detail representative of popular architectural styles. An example is the addition of the "A" framed dormer window which holds a romanesque window and is indicative of the romanesque revival in simple country domestic architecture of the mid - 1860's.

The bay window on the south facade of the brick house was probably constructed in the 1890's, when this feature was so popular in American homes.

An interesting architectural complex, this house is also one of the most notable historically in Lisbon. According to Mr. J. D. Warfield, Mr. Ringgold brought out three chairs from this house in 1825 to General Lafayette as he traveled along the old Baltimore - Frederick Turnpike in answer to the call, "Three Cheers for General Lafayette." In 1837 the house was sold by the heirs of Hammond Welsh and occupied in turn, by a number of prominent local people, including Basil Owings, son of Richard and Ruth Warfield Owings, one of Lisbon's early merchants. Mrs. Holland relates that the store he operated still stands on the south side of the road facing the Woodbine Road.

The Owings Log-Brick House later, according to Mrs. Holland, became the home of Nicholas R. Henderson, whose son, "Lisbon's erstwhile volunteer postman" was born here in 1870. Mr. Henderson, Sr. became one of Howard County's most progressive farmers and the owner of neighboring Oakley Farm.

Historically and architecturally significant to Howard County and the State of Maryland and Lisbon, the Owings Log-Brick House should be placed on the National Register of Historic Landmarks and the State Critical Areas Program.

This frame and brick house is L shaped, facing south, with the wing of brick running north along the west end wall of the brick (west) section. (The east section of frame clapboard was painted to match the painted brick.)

A sketch below shows the house in plan, and illustrates at least three changes that may have been made on the brick house, assuming that it is the original section: a 3 bay center-hall house.

The house is 2 stories high, the frame roof ridge line running east-west as the house faces south. A steep dormer is over the east ~~windows~~ ~~front~~ <sup>wood</sup> section of the facade; a peaked <sup>hipped</sup> roof over the bay ~~front~~ windows added to the west half of the house.


STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

Basil & Ruth Warfall Owings used the building as a store. Later, while a school house was being built it was loaned for that purpose by Mrs Bowie Lemon in 1901.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a combination brick & frame dwelling, the brick portion of which appears to have predated the frame extensions.

The S. elevation, facade, is two storeys with a two storey pyramid gable roofed projecting bay window. This bay possesses three windows of 1/1 pane sash at 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> levels. The door (E end, original half) has elongated multi-paned over & side lights. The frame extension to the originally exposed E. end has two windows, at both levels of this elevation. At the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor level the fenestration and door position of the lower level is repeated.

To the rear (N) wall is a two storey frame wing.

The A roof has a cross gable at the S. elevation toward the east end.

at the facade is a small centered porch with square posts and a simple balustrade at its roof.




