Three early nineteenth century millworker's houses face south on the north side of Washington Street. Each contain two dwelling units. Together they comprise a two story high, six bay wide, gabled roof (running east-west), brick (laid in running bond brick) structure on full foundation with a wide central brick chimney. Rectangular entrance doors rest in the outside bay of each unit and in the south end of the east and west walls. They are surmounted by architraves decorated with simple dentiled entablatures, flanked by fluted pilasters and fronted by brick stoops. Fenestration is vertically aligned and proportionally scaled. Windows are double-hung with six-over-six lights.

These buildings were built shortly after the construction of the adjacent Savage Mill, one of the oldest known surviving textile mills in Maryland, incorporated December, 1821. The operation was funded by John Savage of Philadelphia whose heirs sold the entire complex to William H. Baldwin, Jr. of Baltimore under whom the project prospered and the village expanded.

These three early nineteenth century millworkers homes on the north side of Washington Street each contain two dwelling units. They are two story high, six bay wide, one bay deep, gabled roof (running east-west) brick (laid in common bond brick) structures resting on full foundations. A wide central brick chimney, which serves the two dwelling units is located in the central dividing wall. Rectangular entrance doors rest in the outside bay of each unit and in the south end of the east and west walls. The entrances are surmounted by architraves decorated with simple dentiled entablatures, flanked by fluted pilasters and fronted by brick stoops. Windows are rectangular, double-hung with six-over-six lights, vertically aligned and proportionally scaled.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

These three millworkers houses on the North side of Washington Street are significant historically, architecturally and industrially. These two family dwelling units are located within the Savage Mill Historic District which was placed on the National Register in February, 1975.

The adjacent Savage Mill is one of the oldest known surviving textile mills in Maryland which was incorporated by an act of the General Assembly of Maryland passed at the December session of 1821. John Savage of Philadelphia funded the company whose surrounding district still bears his name. The complex then included a mill and 500 acres of land, comprising parts of the following tracts; White's Contrivance, Henry's Lot, Harry's Lot, Pingstone's Thicket, Warfield's Range, Venison Park, Brother's Partnership, Mill Land, and William's Discovery. (H.C.JLM 3-229)

The industrial complex included a warehouse, a flour mill and a saw mill. Warner Warfield deeded property to the Savage Manufacturing Company on the 8th April, 1822. By 1825 the mill employed 200 people including women and children and 120 power looms. The complex grew to include a grist mill, an iron foundry and a machine shop. Samuel Hinks, one of the employees, later became Mayor of Baltimore.

In 1847, after the death of John Savage and a court action by his heirs, the entire operation was sold to William H. Baldwin, Jr., of a well established Baltimore dry goods marketing firm. Under his management the Savage plant prospered. The majority of the workers houses in the village date from this period.

These three duplexes on the North side of Washington Street certainly date from this period or earlier.

Architecturally, they are representative of early 19th century millworkers homes. Solidly constructed with fine proportions, they provide a unique and interesting architectural assemblage indicating the development of and contribution to low and moderate income housing needs by private industry in Maryland. In addition, the village is a fine example of early 19th century urban planning

by industry, utilizing the grid pattern and locating housing in close proximity to work.

One of three multi-family houses, almost identical in appearance, but one has a two-family plan, the others four families each.

Oblong, brick painted white, two stories high, the gable roof has one large chimney rising from 2 fireplaces on each floor. Faced south, 6 bays by 2, each building has two doors on the south, the double house has two back doors on the north, while the other buildings have a door in each end wall to the upstairs apartments. Windows have 6 lights over 6, and are unshuttered.

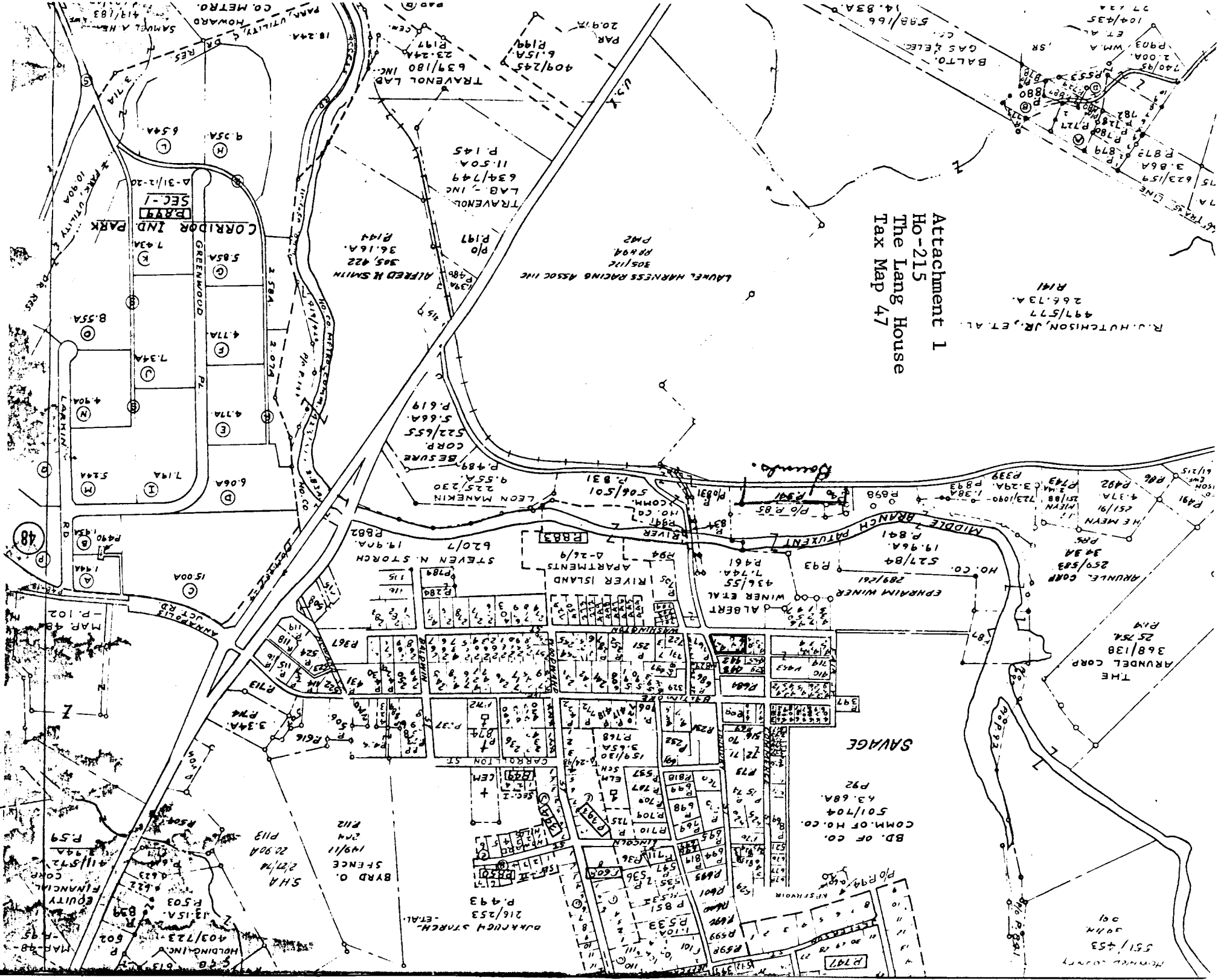

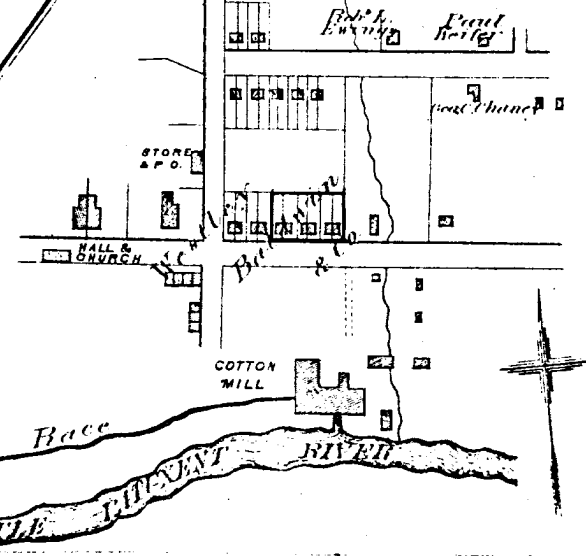

Hopkins Atlas of 1878



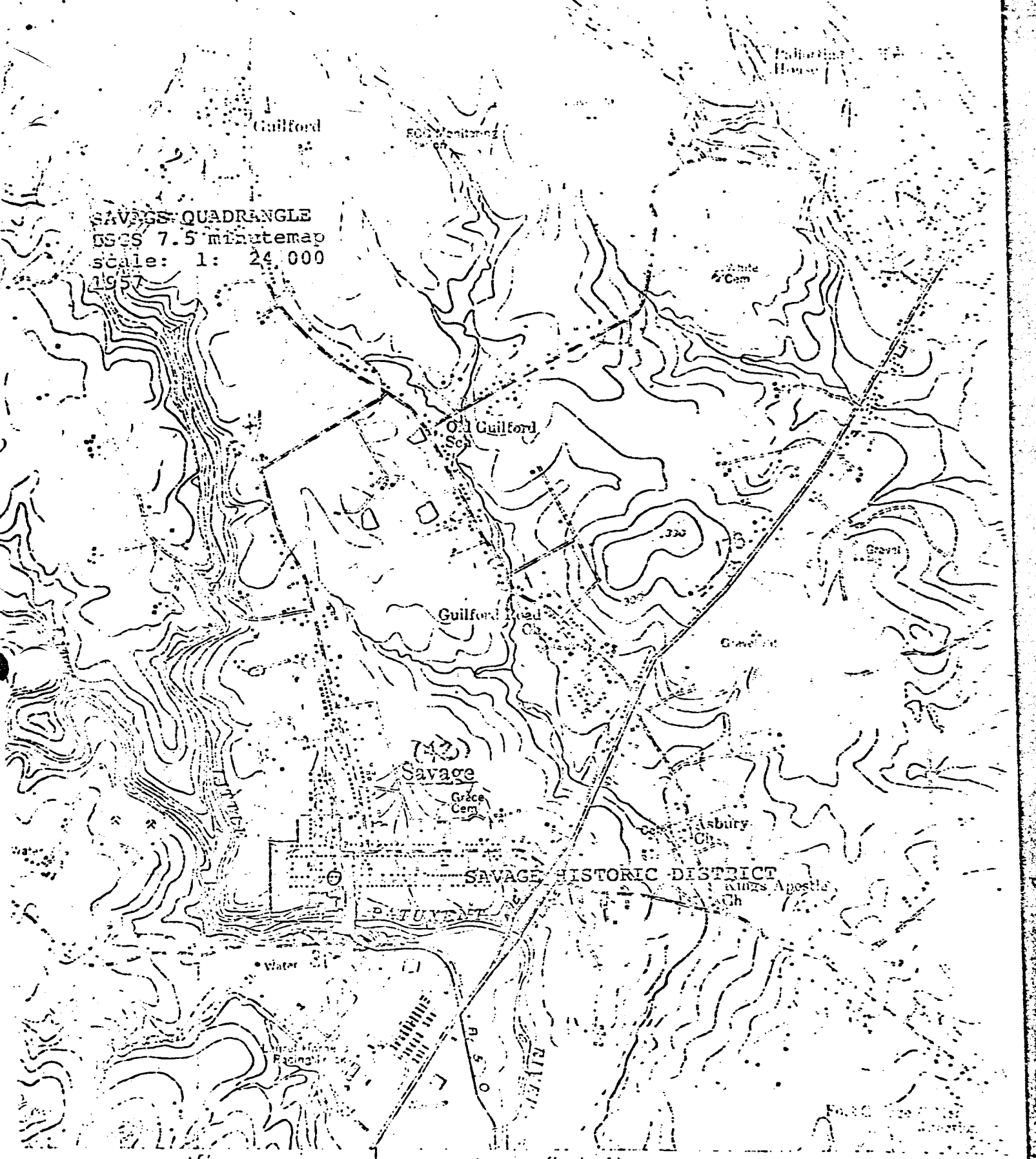

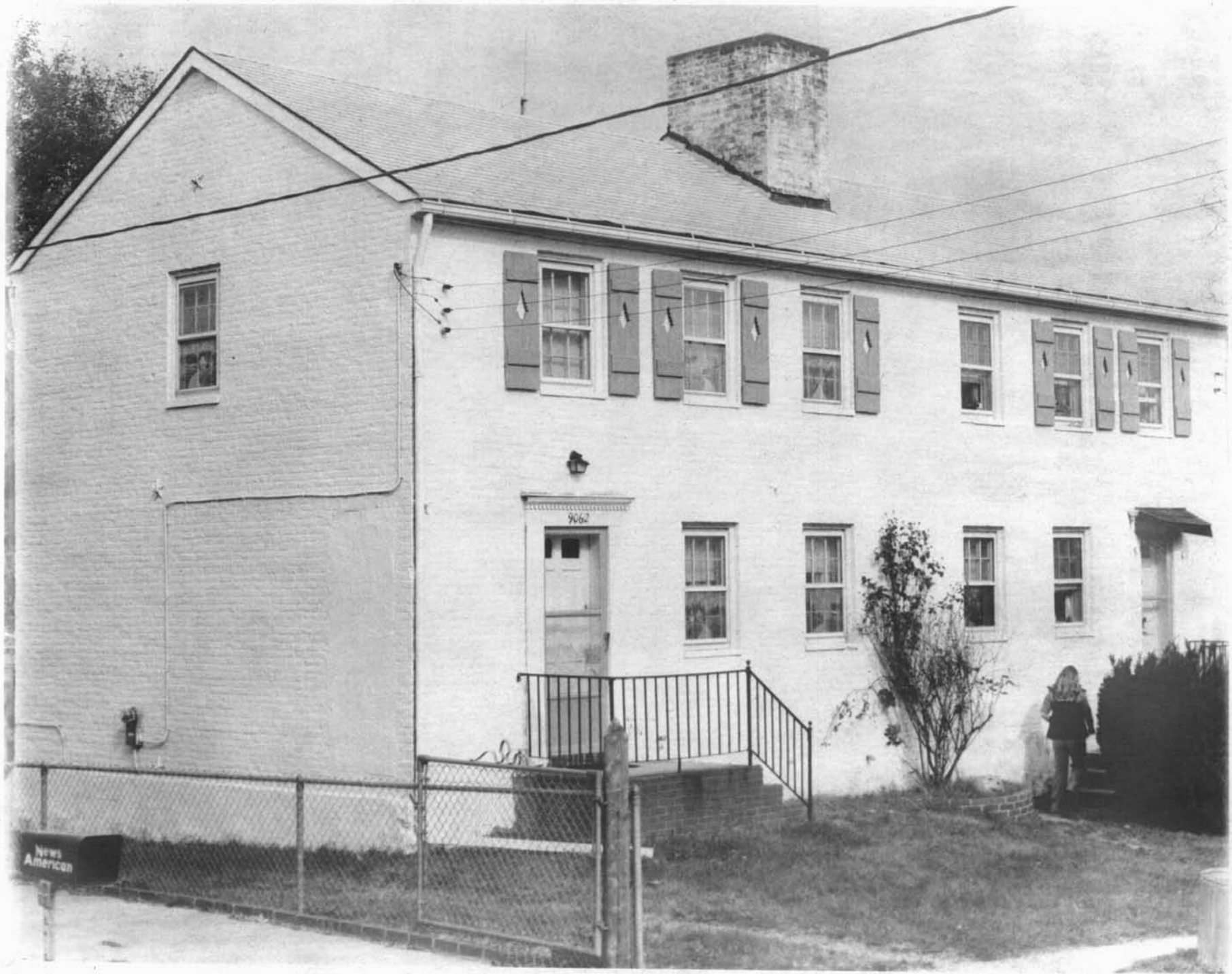

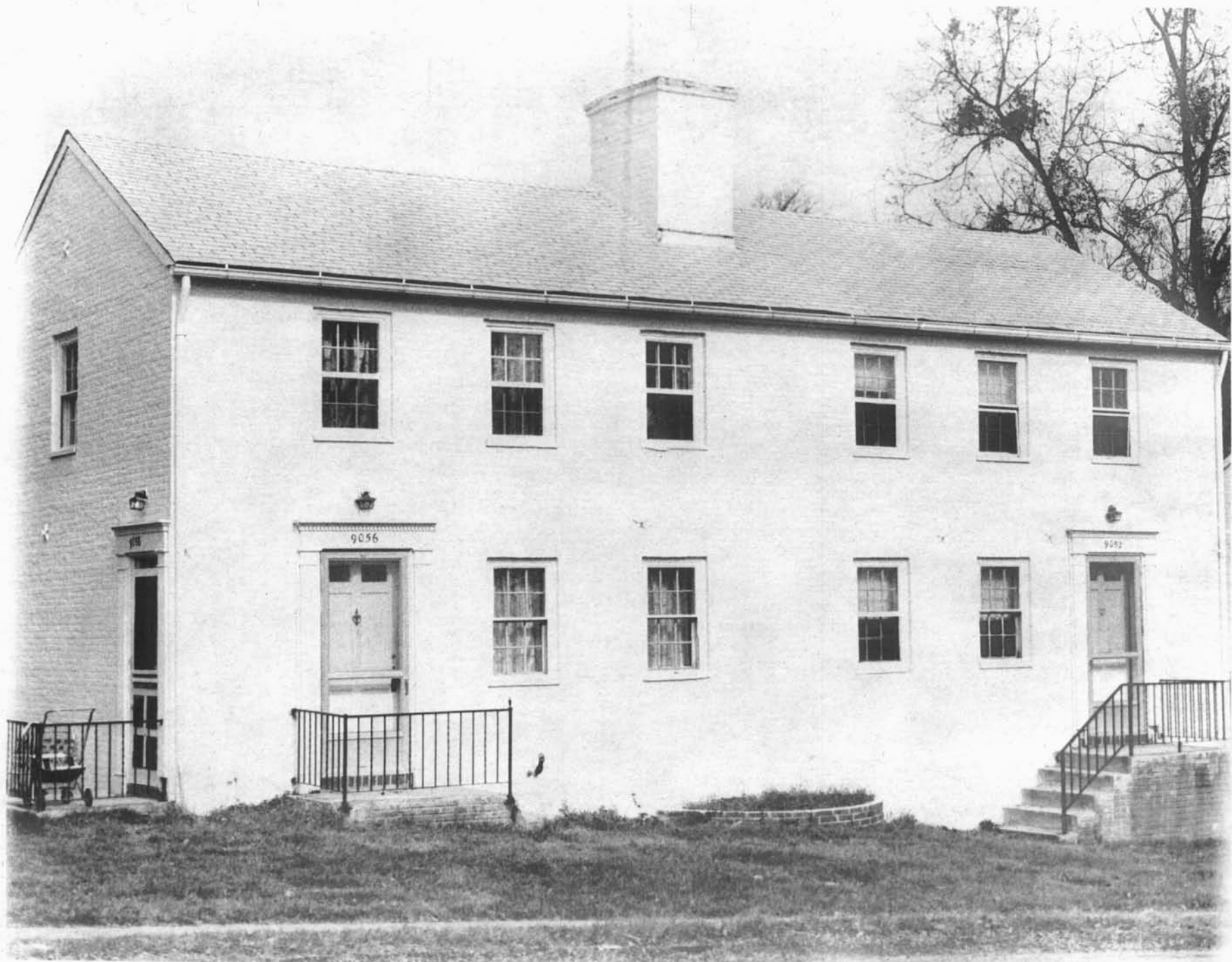
SAVAGE QUADRANGLE
