LISBON METHODIST CHURCH

Private Lisbon

circa 1883

The Lisbon Methodist Church faces south on the northeast corner of Route 144 and Hopkins Alley. It is a three bay wide, four bay deep, gabled roof (running north-south) frame structure whose central projecting entrance bay rises to taper into a tall, square tent roofed, open, gothic arched belfry whose cornice is decorated with a row of dentils.

The central rectangular entrance door is surmounted by a gothic arched, stained glass transom on which is inscribed 'Lisbon Methodist Church'. Gothic windows flank the entrance, with four similar ones resting in the east and west walls of the church.

Begun on September 25, 1882 with a half acre of ground conveyed to the trustees of the church by Mr. and Mrs. John. W. Buckingham, it was completed in 1883 under the direction of Reverend James Codden and Daniel Hartsock. Those who gave time and/or money for its construction were Benjamin Barnes, Stephen Hood, George R. Leach and John Bond.

#### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lisbon Methodist Church faces south on the north east corner of Route 144 and Hopkins Alley. It is a three bay wide, four bay deep, gabled roof (running north-south) frame structure, built on a stone foundation, with tall brick chimneys rising from the east and west sides of its gabled roof.

The central projecting south bay holds the double rectangular main entrance to the church which is surmounted by a gothic arched stained glass transom on which is inscribed "Lisbon Methodist Church." The east and west faces of this projecting bay hold single gothic arched stained glass windows. This central projecting bay rises, tapering into a tall central, tent roofed, open belfry which features open gothic arches and a cornice decorated with a row of dentils. Beneath the belfry rests a gothic arched window, similar to those described.

The east and west elevations of the church are identical, holding four tall gothic arched stained glass windows.

No apertures occur on the north wall of the church, from which a one story high, gabled roof (running north-south) one story high addition extends northward on its north west corner. It holds a rectangular, double-hung window with six-over-six lights.

Three wide three sided cement steps lead to the central entrance door.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Lisbon Methodist Episcopal Church is architecturally, historically, and religiously significant to Howard County.

Architecturally it is representative of the fine old frame Gothic churches which are scattered throughout Howard County.

Its tall central projecting bay which tapers into a tall square, tent roofed open belfry is particularly fine. This vertical element is well scaled to the finely proportioned, gabled roof frame church.

In a history of the Lisbon M.E. Church which is being compiled by Mrs. Mary Slagle, the following facts were uncovered.

The religious life of Lisbon began as an ecumenical one with Caleb Pancoast offering to open his home for religious services. On August, 1820, a non-sectarian church, called The Freestone Church, was created, a forerunner of the Lisbon Methodist Church. It was located where the Lisbon School now stands, hence the name Church Alley, for the street running along its western boundary. There was a stipulation that this church be used by the Methodistsone day every two weeks for the purpose of the circuit preacher.

On September 25, 1882 work was begun on the construction of the present church under the direction of the Reverend James Codden and Daniel Hartsock, one of the original trustees. Benjamin Barnes is also identified as a trustee of the Lisbon M.E. Church along with Stephen G. Hood, George R. Leach and John W. Buckingham. One half acre of land was given to the trustees by John W. Buckingham and wife (LJW 46-157). Those assisting in the work of building the church were John Patrick, George Long, George Leach, Benjamin Barnes and John Bond who gave time and/or money in its construction.

According to Mrs. Celia Holland's article on Lisbon, Maryland in <u>The Times, Ellicott City</u>, Lisbon left the St. James Circuit in 1930 and joined the Poplar Springs Circuit which was a Methodist Protestant Circuit. Under the Reverend Mr. Fisher in 1961, Lisbon became a separate station.

Mrs. Holland relates an interesting legend connected to the bell of the church.

"It is said that many years ago a traveler (on foot) stopped on a cold winter evening at several places in the village, hoping for free overnight accomodations. Finally someone suggested that he sleep in the church vestibule. Welcoming any shelter from the cold and wind, he spent the night there and was on his way in the morning before the little town was awake. Several years later, in better fortune, he sent money to the people of the village to be used for a church bell in appreciation for the night's lodging. The bell is said to still be in use, but how many members of the present congregation are aware of the story attached to its 'cquisition is unknown."

Architecturally and historically noteworthy to the religious heritage of Howard County, Lisbon Methodist Church and the town of Lisbon should be placed on the National Register of Historic Places and the State Critical Areas Program.
