Windy Acres faces west on the east side of Pindell School Road, three houses south of its intersection with Johns Hopkins Road.

It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame house, resting on a stone foundation with square brick chimneys, with corbeled edges, inset into its north and south walls and a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, intersecting gable roof (running east-west) frame east wing constructed along the south bay of the building's east wall, with square, central brick chimney inset into its east wall. A one story high, shed roofed addition has been made along the south and east elevations of the building and a two story high, shed roofed addition takes up the northeast corner of the building, created by the "L".

Fenestration is vertically aligned and proportionally scaled. Windows are rectangular and double-hung, holding six-over-six lights.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Windy Acres faces west on the east side of Pindell School Road, three houses south of its intersection with Johns Hopkins Road.

It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame house, resting on a stone foundation, with square brick chimneys, with corbeled edges, inset into its north and south walls and a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, intersecting gable roof (running east-west) frame east wing constructed along the south bay of the building's east wall, with square central brick chimney inset into its east wall. What once may have been a one story high, shed roofed open porch along this section's east wall has been enclosed and incorporated into the house.

Fenestration for the house is vertically aligned and proportionally scaled. Windows are rectangular and double-hung, holding six-over-six lights throughout the house. They are flanked by flat wooden pilasters, surmounted by flat wooden lintels and underlined by projecting wooden sills.

The house features a central entrance and hall with a first and second floor room on either side of the hall.

Two more additions complete the house. 1) A one story high, shed roofed, one room deep addition runs along the south elevation of the house, holding a rectangular south entrance, covered by a shed roofed portico. 2) A three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, shed roofed addition takes up the north-east corner of the building, created by the "L" plan. This addition features three second floor east windows, similar to those described.

A breezeway runs between the east side of the house and its two car garage.

Northeast of the building are two large poplar trees. The building is surrounded on all sides by mature trees and bushes.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Windy Acres is significant historically to Howard County and the State of Maryland in the area of local history and architecturally, as an example of mid-nineteenth century domestic frame architecture, constructed in an "L" plan.

Historically, the house stands on a tract of land called "Snowden's Second Addition", which was owned by Hamilton Moore, who lived south Windy Acres in 1866. On 7 February, 1866, he and his wife Eviline, conveyed 100 45 Acres of land to William Moore for \$2,400 (25-64).

No house appears on the 1860 Atlas in this location so that sometime after 1860 and before 1866 the building was constructed.

An Equity Case on June 25, 1872 between Mary C. Moore executrix vs. et al resulted in a Sale of the house to Catharine Wallick for \$2,500 on December 29, 1874. Another deed of May 19, 1876 (36-400) also conveys the deed from Mary C. Moore of Washington, D. C. to Catherine Wallick. The name Winfield S. Wallick appears on the 1878 Hopkins Atlas. See Attachment 3.

Architecturally, the building is representative of Howard County's midnineteenth century domestic frame architecture, constructed in an "L" plan with later additions well integrated into the building.

Designated one of Howard County's Historic Houses by the Howard County Bicentennial Commission, it has been issued an Historic House Plaque and stands as one of Howard County's fine mid-nineteenth century landmarks.




