THE OLD ELLICOTT CITY - MONTGOMERY COUNTY COURTHOUSE ROAD
MILESTONES
Public circa 1804
Ellicott City

The 4 and 5 Mile Milestones face South on the North side of Route 108, four and five miles from the Southwest corner of Old Columbia Pike's intersection with Main Street in Ellicott City. They are approximately twelve inches in width and some eight inches in depth, and stand about thirty feet above the ground. On their South face is incribed: 4 -(5) MI. To E.C. (4 - 5 miles to Ellicott City). A two Mile Milestone faces east on the west side of Old Columbia Pike, 1/10 of a mile south of the Old Wayside Inn, HO-144. Another stone, the ten (10) Mile Milestone faces south on the north side of Route 108 at the entrance to Lambing Meadow Bank Barn and Farm, HO-468.

This old road was once the most important road to Washington, D.C., starting at Ellicott Mills and going to Montgomery County Courthouse as early as 1797.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The four and five mile Milestones face south on the north side of the old road leading from Ellicott City to the Montgomery County Courthouse. They are four and five miles west of Old Columbia Pike's intersection with Main Street, Ellicott City, Maryland.

The Old Columbia Pike and a section of Route 29, as well as Route 108, running west to Rockville from its intersection with Route 29 follow the old road. Columbia Pike to Route 108, on the west side of Route 29 was also a part of the old road.

The present Route 29 runs just a few feet east of the old road, running parallel to it.

Owned by the State of Maryland on the edge of the right-of-way, the stones are completely assessible to the public.

The granite blocks are about twelve to fourteen inches wide, eight inches deep and project about thirty inches above grade.

On their south face is inscribed "4 M to E.C." (4 miles to Ellicott City) and "5 M to E.C." (5 miles to Ellicott City) respectively. The other three faces bear no inscription.

These stones appear to be of Baltimore gneiss from the Ellicott City area.

A two (2) Mile Milestone faces east on the west side of Old Columbia Pike, 1/10 of a mile south of the Old Wayside Inn, HO-144. Another stone, the ten (10) Mile Milestone faces south on the north side of Route 108 at the entrance to Lambing Meadow Bank Barn & Farm, HO-468.

All these stones mark the old road and should be placed on the National Register to insure their preservation, since present State Highway plans call for a widening of Route 108.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Ellicott City- Montgomery County Courthouse Road Milestones are significant in the field of transportation and communications. They mark the original route of this old road, existing in 1797, and designate distances. Plans to widen and realign Route 108 threaten these stones. Any displacement of any of these Milestones as a result of this highway project must include a plan for their immediate relocation on the right of way as close as possible to their original sites. Inclusion to the National Register of Historic models would help to insure such preservation, and immediate action should be taken to initiate the proceedings for such inclusion.

A reference in a newspaper article in the Baltimore Telegraphe and Daily Advertiser, dated October 18, 1804, notes Porter's Tavern "standing on the road leading from Ellicott Mills to Montgomery Court House". The four and five mile milestones are found East of HO-135, Porter's Tavern, while a two (2) mile milestone is found facing east on the west side of Old Columbia Pike, 1/10 of a mile South of the Old Wayside Inn, HO-144, and a ten (10) mile milestone is found facing South on the North side of Route 108 at the entrance of Lambing Meadow Bank Barn and Farm.

In conclusion, all existing milestones which remain to mark the original old road leading from Ellicott City to Montgomery County Courthouse and on to Washington, D.C. should <u>immediately</u> be placed on the National Register of Historic Landmarks.
