HO-489 The Owing's House Lisbon Private

The Owing's House faces north on the southeast corner of Madison Street and Route 144. It is a three bay wide, two bay deep, two and a half story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame building, resting on a stone foundation, with square brick chimneys inset into its east and west walls and a roman arched, attic window inset into the central intersecting gable (running north-south) north facade, which also features a central entrance, surmounted by a three light transom, proportionally scaled and vertically aligned fenestration, holding one-over-one lights and a one story high, hipped roof, open porch running along this entire elevation.

A two story high, two bay wide, one room deep, gabled roof (running north-south) frame kitchen wing with square brick chimney centered into its south wall extends south from the west side of the building's south wall. This section features additional east and west entrances, with varied modernized fenestration occurring on its east wall.

Acquired by Nickolas R. Henderson from Charles D. Warfield on June 30, 1858, it passed to Edwin V. Owings, who owned the general store across the street, HO-205, Lee's Store and House, on February 27, 1860.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Owings House faces north on the southeast corner of Madison Street and Route 144. It is a three bay wide, two bay deep, two and a half story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame (covered with aluminum siding) building, resting on a stone foundation with square brick chimneys inset into its east and west walls and a roman arched, attic window inset into the central intersecting gable (running north-south) on the north facade, which also features a central entrance, surmounted by a three light transom, and hipped roof, one story high, open porch along this entire elevation.

A two story high, two bay wide, one room deep, gabled roof (running north-south) frame kitchen wing, with square brick chimney centered into its south wall, extends south from the west side of the building's south wall.

Fenestration is rectangular, double-hung; proportionally scaled and vertically aligned, holding one-over-one lights. Two square attic windows are located in the east and west walls of the front section of the house. The east and west walls of the building's front section hold two first and second floor windows, similar to those on the north wall. Varied windows are cut into the east wall of the building's south wing, which also holds additional entrances, located on its east and west walls. That on the east is covered by a shed roofed aluminum awning, supported by two iron posts, while that on the west is covered by another aluminum, shed roofed awning which runs along this section's entire west wall. Four cement steps lead to the two light rectangular entrance, flanked by rectangular, one-over-one light windows. A cellar door is located beneath that window on the north. Above rest two similar second floor windows.

The south elevation of this wing holds a first floor window on its west side, a second floor window on its east side and two square attic windows, that on the east holding four lights. A square brick chimney is inset into the center of this wall.

The house is in excellent condition and is representative of the romanesque revival in simple domestic American architecture of the 1860's.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Owings House in Lisbon is significant architecturally as representative of Romanesque Revival in American domestic architecture in the United States and historically significant in the field of local history regarding this early nineteenth century town, laid out in 1811 by Caleb Pancoast.

Architecturally it not only serves as a representative of the Romanesque Revival style in American domestic architecture as evidenced by the Roman arched, four light casement window inset into its central intersecting gable on the north facade of the building, but in addition its location on the southeast corner of Madison Street and Route 144 creates an architectural anchor for this block which has been broken by the relocation southward of HO-233, located east of the Owing's House and the Exxon Service Station, located east of HO-233.

Four original buildings each occupy a section of the four corners of this intersection, making it one of the most important areas of the town architecturally.

Historically the building can be traced back to 1858 when it was acquired by Nickolas Henderson on June 30, 1858 from Charles D. Warfield.

Edwin U. Owings, who owned and ran the General Store, HO-205, Lee's Store and House, on the southwest corner of this intersection, acquired the house on February 27, 1860 from Mr. Henderson (21-51) for \$800, comprising lots #34 and #84, a half acre of land.

It remained in the Owings family until 1899 when it was acquired by Merriman Fisher for \$3,300.

On 13 June 1940 it was sold at public auction for \$2,200 to William and Lelia Frey, present owners.

Architecturally and historically significant, this house, in conjunction with the entire early nineteenth century town of Lisbon, should be placed on the National Register of Historic Places and included in the State Critical Areas Program.




