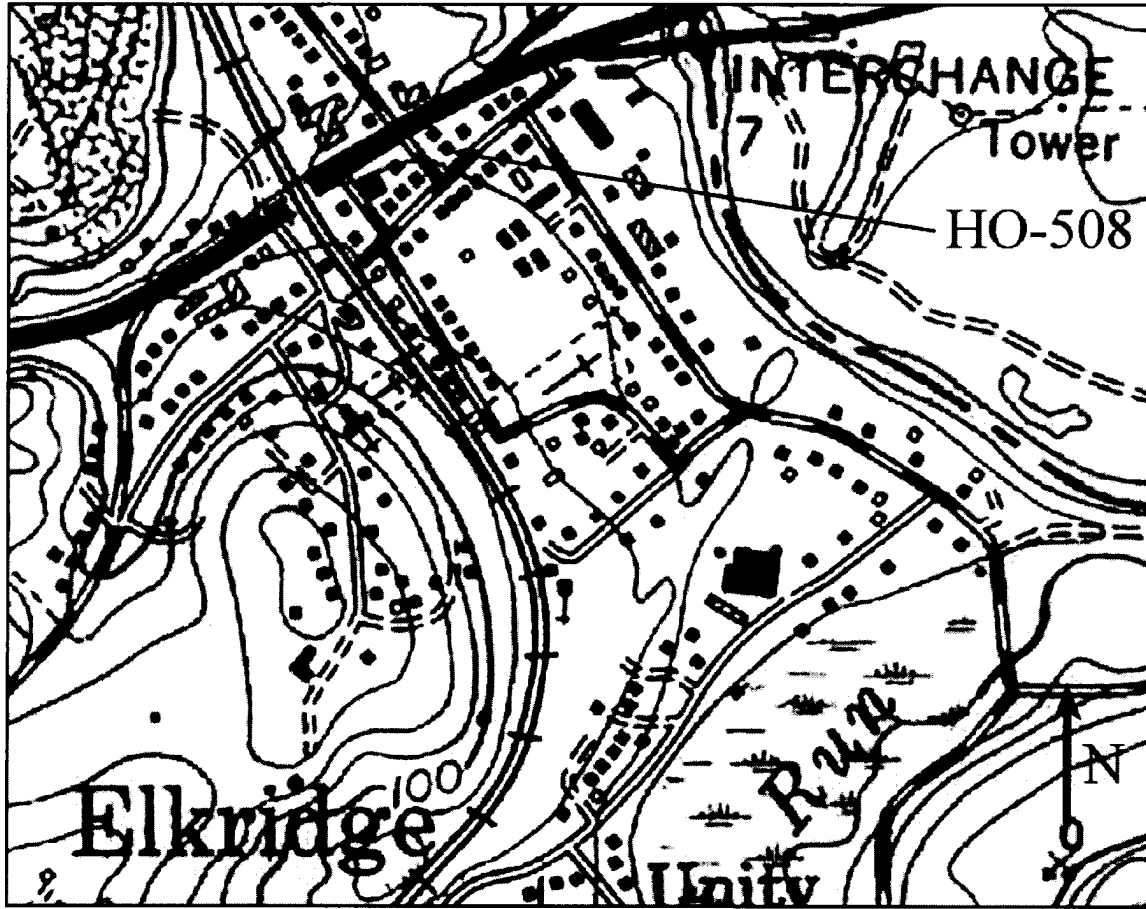

Section 7. Description

According to the 1970's inventory form, this building was built in 1906 as the Elkridge Country Club. The single story building with a side gabled roof has had many additions and alterations over the years. The building description written in the 1970's is accurate, although by that time many of the buildings important features had already been altered. Today, the building is in very good condition, but continued alterations and modernizations have all but destroyed the historic integrity of the building. All of the windows are vinyl replacements, the exterior of the frame building has been covered with wood shingles, and the roof is covered with asphalt shingles. The front of the building is now the west façade facing Levering Avenue which holds a bumped out triangular bay containing the front entry door. An early 20th century photograph of the building shows a wide wrap around porch supported by simple Doric style columns running along the south and west facades. This porch has been enclosed and reworked and the columns are gone. The only exterior feature that looks at all like it did in the early 20th century is the steeply pitched gable roof with two dormers. The defining feature of the interior space was the single large hall where gatherings and dinners were held. Today, that space has been partitioned and the entire building is used as a flower shop.

Now a commercial building, housing Berkley Pools, the former Elkridge Country Club Building faces south on the northeast corner of Main Street and Levering Avenue. It was constructed at the beginning of the twentieth century for use as a large social hall for The Elkridge Community. Its south facade, which features rectangular end bay entrances with first floor windows in its two central bays and two gabled roof dormer windows placed in its gable roof, is in keeping with the colonial and victorian buidings found along Main Street, Elkridge.

A one story high, intersecting gable roof (running north and south) north section, extending from the north wall of the front sections gives the appearance that the building has interior divided sections. Its interior, however, was originally one single, large room with a gabled roof (running north-south) one story high, kitchen addition along its north wall. A one story high open porch along its east elevation has now been enclosed to provide additional interior space.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Elkridge Country Club Building faces south on the northeast corner of Main Street and Levering Avenue.

It is a four bay wide, two bay deep, one and a half story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame (covered with wooden shingles) building, resting on a cinder block foundation and extending north into a one story high, four bay wide, two bay deep, intersecting gable roof (running north-south) shingled north section of the building, which also rests on a cinder block foundation, to which is attached a one story high, two bay wide, one bay deep, gabled kitchen addition attached to its north wall.

Constructed for use as the Elkridge Country Club, it holds one very large hall with the kitchen wing along its north wall and one story high, open porches along its entire east wall, which have been enclosed.

Proportionally scaled, vertically aligned fenestration was originally featured on both the east and west elevations of the front section of the building (the east wall now holds the shed roof enclosed porch). These elevations hold second floor windows, although the interior holds no second floor, but is entirely open.

All the windows for the building are rectangular and double-hung, holding one-over-one lights, flanked by flat pilasters, surmounted by flat lintels and underlined by flat wooden sills.

SOUTH ELEVATION

Rectangular entrances are located on the end bays of the south facade of the building, with two first floor windows, similar to those described placed in the two central bays. Two gabled roof dormer windows hold rectangular, double-hung windows, with two-over-two lights.

The south wall of the shed roofed, one story high, enclosed porch, now used as an office, holds another first floor window, similar to those already described.

THE WEST ELEVATION OF THE NORTH SECTION

The west elevation of this section holds a very wide, double paneled entrance door, flanked by flat pilasters and surmounted by a flat lintel. Three open wooden steps lead to this entrance, located in the second north bay of this west wall. The west wall of the kitchen addition also holds a rectangular entrance, fronted by a stoop.

THE EAST ELEVATION

The east elevation once held the rest rooms on the north side of this

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Elkridge Country Club Building is significant to the State of Maryland and Howard County for its architectural and social role in the history of Elkridge, an area which figured in the early commercial and maritime history of Howard County and the State of Maryland.

Historically, constructed in the early twentieth century, in the days when lower Main Street, Elkridge was a thriving commercial center, the Elkridge Country Club provided a social center for the politicians and residents of Elkridge. At that time Elkridge and the first election district wielded major political influence in Howard County and a large number of its citizens played an important role in day-to-day politics. In the mid-twentieth century growth began to occur in districts two and six and with the advent of the New Town of Columbia, Maryland, located predominantly in districts five and six, the political influence of Elkridge waned.

Residents of the Elkridge area remember the Country Club fondly. Bridge was held there on afternoons and dancing classes for the children of the area, as well as major social events in the evening for the adult community. It also furnished employment on a small scale. Families whose daughters waitressed here, married those daughters here, and generally it was a social focal point for the community.

Architecturally, the design and scale of the building complements and harmonizes with the other buildings along lower Main Street. The two gabled roof dormer windows on its south facade repeat those on the opposite side of the street in the Tilghman-Ferraro House, while the story and a half height of the building harmonizes with the two story buildings which surround it.

The architectural design of its south facade and intersecting gabled roof north section, coupled with the texture provided by its shingled siding, softens a building which could easily have become quite imposing and dominating in the general streetscape of Main Street.

By such detail and design, the building not only becomes a contributing building in the Main Street, Elkridge Historic District proposal, but a building of architectural merit in its own right.

Of social, historical and architectural merit, the Elkridge Country Club

Building should, along with the Main Street, Elkridge Historic District, be considered for inclusion to the National Register of Historic Places, the State Critical Areas Program and any local landmark legislation the citizens of Howard County might seek to initiate, should its owners so desire.

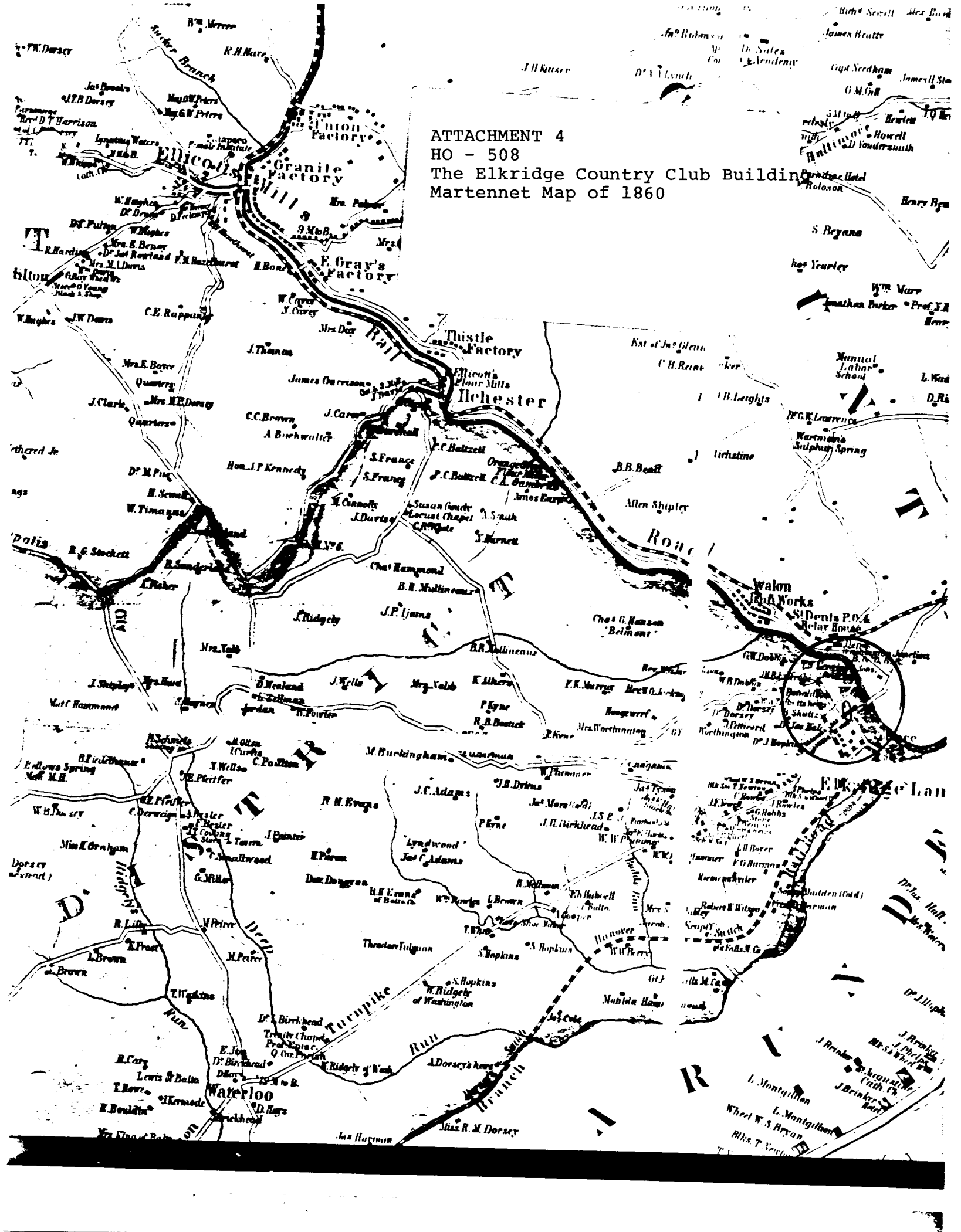

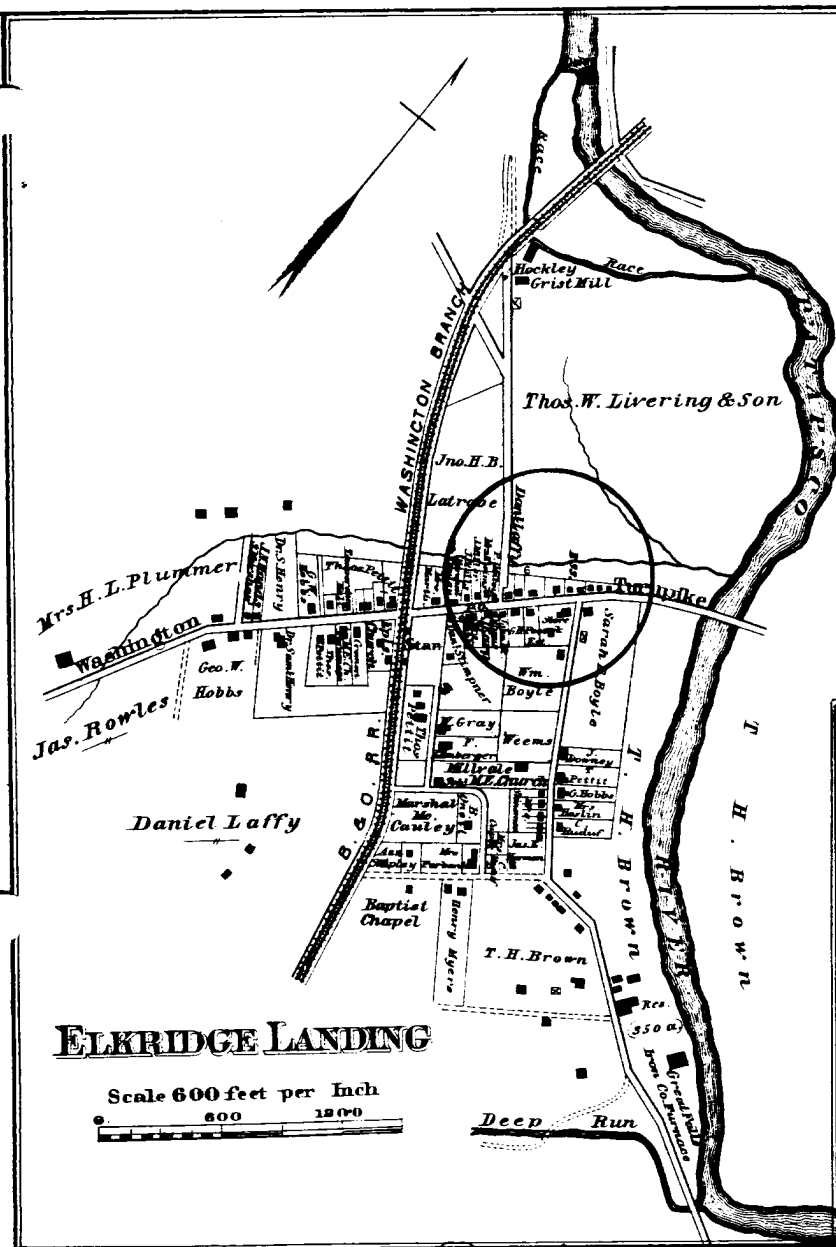

Martennet Map of 1860

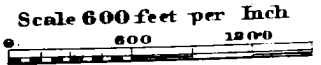

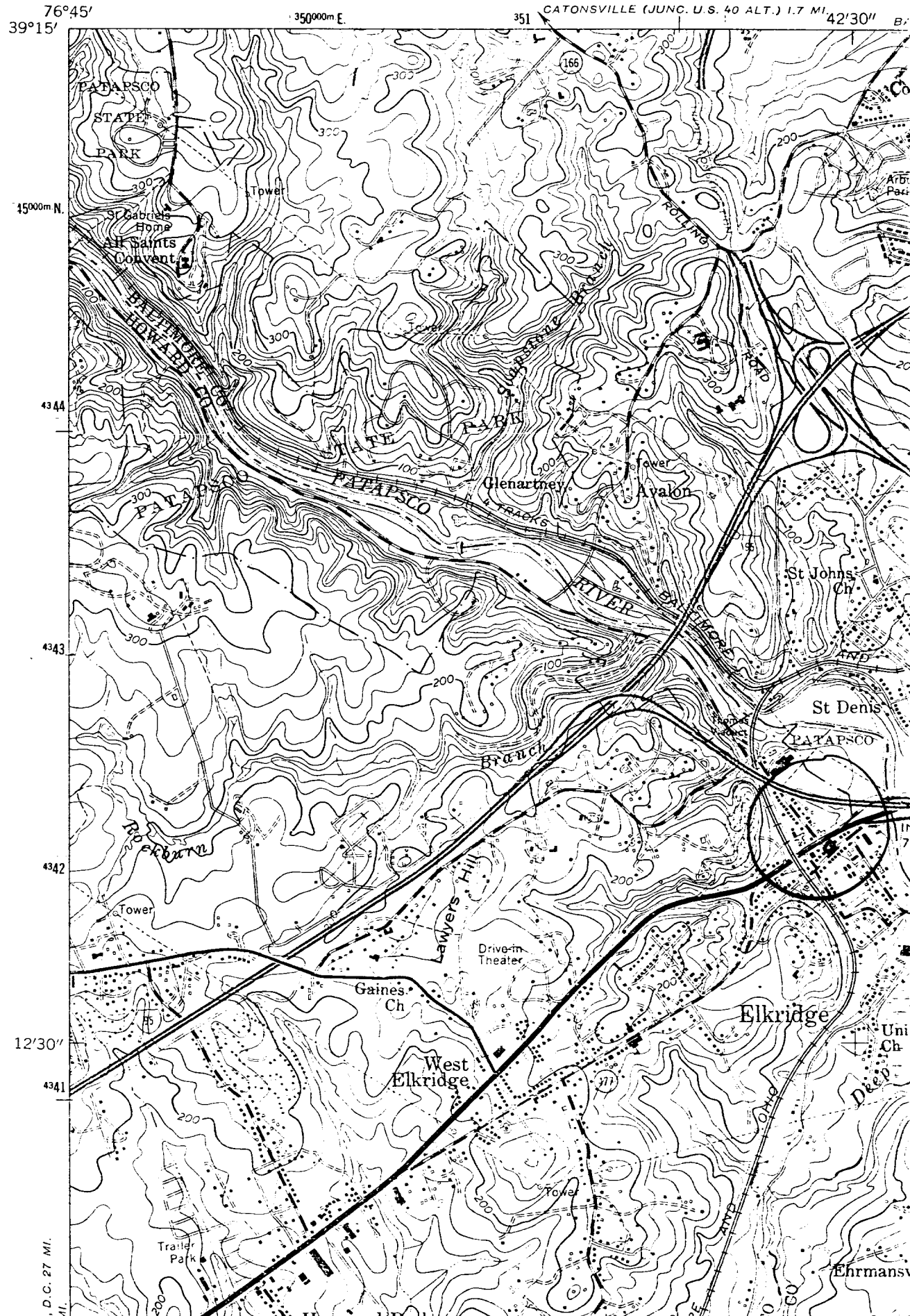
