Private

The Guilford General Store and Post Office Building faces south on the north side of Route 32, one building west of its intersection with Oakland Mills Road.

It is a three bay wide, three bay deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) German siding, frame building, resting on a stone foundation, with square, brick, central chimney.

It features a central rectangular, two-two light, double paneled south entrance, flanked by rectangular, double-hung windows, with two-over-two lights, covered by a one story high, shed roofed open porch, supported by four square columns. Three second floor windows on this facade are vertically aligned and proportionally scaled to the apertures below. The north wall of the building features a one story high, semi-enclosed, shed roofed, screened in porch along its entire elevation. A single, second floor window is centered on this wall, with first floor rectangular entrance in the east bay.

The building's east wall holds two first floor windows and three proportionally scaled floor windows, two of which are vertically aligned to those below.

The west wall of the building is similarly treated.

The Guilford General Store and Post Office Building is located just west of the old Guilford School House.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Guilford General Store and Post Office is significant to Howard County and the State of Maryland in two areas.

Architecturally, it is reminiscent of Pindell's Store on Route 97 in Glenwood, as well as HO-205, Lee's Market in Lisbon, Maryland (without later ornamentation). All three are two story high, gabled roof, rectangular buildings, with tall, rectangular, vertically aligned fenestration.

Historically, the land on which the building stands was conveyed to Martin L. Pattison on June 7, 1876 (37-29). No building is delineated here on the 1878 Hopkin's Atlas except the school house on the corner. By 30 March, 1880, Martin Pattison had conveyed the lot to Catharine Reed, who, with her husband, James Reed, conveyed the lot to Martin Lilly on September 4, 1882 (45-326). By December 7, 1891, it is believed that the building had been constructed. A deed of that date from John Rogers, trustee, to William Lilly mentions the lot "together with the buildings".

William and Lovena Lilly held the property for two years, upon which time they sold it to William Baker, bachelor, for \$100. A year later William Baker sold the property "together with buildings" to Sarah Saks on August 23, 1894 (62-66).

By 1903, the property had appreciated to \$1,000. Sarah Saks and her husband, Joseph, of Baltimore City, sold it to James J. Miller and Andrew M. Kirkpatrick on March 28 (76-629).

Ten years later, on September 30, 1913, William C. Handley and his wife, Frances, acquired the property (106-165), holding it for seven years, at which time, on December 20, 1920, it was acquired, by deed, by John and Anna Tipton of Baltimore City. Two days later, Anna M. and Maurice V. Haslup acquired the property (111-486) and held it for seventeen years. It was at this time that it was operated as a General Store and Post Office. On August 18, 1937, the Haslups sold their property (157-551) to Lot and Katie Waters, who made it their home, holding it for only three years, and then conveying it to Andrew H. Kraft on September 10, 1940 (168-467), who had a meat business, Kraft Brothers, in Ellicott City. Eight years later, the present owners, Mr. and Mrs. Emory Johnson, acquired the property and occupy it as their home today.

Architecturally and historically noteworthy, the Guilford General Store and Post Office should, if its owners so desire, be placed on the National Register of Historic Places, The State Critical Areas Program and any local landmark ordinance which the citizens of Howard County might seek to initiate.






