The Zeltmann House faces east, on the southeast corner of Route 103 and 01d Montgomery Road. It is a three bay wide, gabled roof (running north-south) frame (covered with shingles) house, off whose west wall extends a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, intersecting gable roof (running east-west) frame, shingled, west wing, which originally created a "T" plan. Later, two story high, intersecting gable and one story high, additions, have filled in the south west corner of the "T".

One story high, open porches run along the north and east elevations, covering rectangular entrances.

Fenestration for the house is vertically aligned, rectangular and double-hung, holding six-over-six lights.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Zeltman House faces east on the southeast corner of Route 103 and 01d Montgomery Road. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame (covered with shingles) house, resting on a stone foundation, off whose west wall extends a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, intersecting gable roof (running east-west) frame, shingled west wing, which originally created a "T" plan. Later additions, however have filled in the southwest corner of the "T". They are 1) a two story high, one bay wide, two bay deep, intersecting gable-roof (running north-south) addition, which is constructed along the west wall of the main body of the house, creating a twin gable on the south elevation. 2) A one story high, shed roofed addition along the south wall of the main body of the house, and 3) a one story high, shed roofed addition along the remaining south wall of the two bay wide west wing section of the house. One story high, open porches run along the north and east elevations of the house, covering rectangular north and east entrances.

Fenestration for the house is vertically aligned, rectangular and double-hung, holding six-over-six lights.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Zeltman House is significant to Howard County and the State of Maryland architecturally and historically.

Architecturally, it is representative of the vernacular frame architecture of Howard County, Maryland and how it grew with the needs of its successive owners. As such, it is significant to Howard County as an example of such basic, two story high, one room deep, two or three bay wide, gabled roof, frame buildings, which were either constructed in an "L" or "T" plan or had later additions, which created such a plan. One story high, open porches usually covered entrances, providing a degree of protection during inclement weather, as we see in the Zeltman House.

Only a few nineteenth century houses remain on the north and south sides of Route 103, once known as Elkridge Landing Road, and commonly called Montgomery Road, from its intersection with Old Montgomery Road east to its intersection with U.S. Route 1. As one of such a few in number, the Zeltman House, constructed in 1854, and noted on the Martennet Map of 1860 (See Attachment 4), grows in significance. This is coupled with the fact that it is located at an intersection, and therefore, may be affected by future highway projects.

Additionally, this once thirteen acre tract was carved out of a larger tract of land called "Weaver's Lot". This fact also adds to its significance. As early as 1854, the 13 acre lot "together with all and singular the buildings" was conveyed to Louis Zealtman by William Haynes and his wife for \$138.75. This thirteen (13) acre tract of land remained intact as late as 1951, when it was conveyed to Anna Breitling and Margaret Lotz.

The history of the house is of significance to Howard County as the property of the Simon, Wess, Zeltman, Wehlands and Miller families. From 1854 to 1872, the house was the home of the Zeltman family. During that time, Katura and Louis Zealtman raised a family of six children; Frederick, Jacob, Henry, Andrew, Katherine and John. In 1872, the house was sold at public auction and acquired by Diedrick and Elizabeth Wehland for \$865 on February 19, 1873. The Wehland family held the property for only six years, when they sold it to Mary C. Simon in 1879, (40-581) for \$1500. In 1895, Mary C. Simon and her husband granted a deed to the property to Herman H. Wess for \$1350. For the next thirty years, Herman and Susan Wess owned the house, conveying it to Henry L. Miller on May 9, 1924. The Miller family held the property for over twenty years, until 1946, when Anna A. Miller conveyed the property to J. George Breitling.

Such an outline is presented for the purpose of indicating its importance to the local history of this particular area of Howard County.
