Private

The Humphrie Tenant House faces south on the north side of Rockburn Branch Road, just east of the Goldbeater's Cottage. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, one story high, gabled roof (running eastwest) frame house, resting on a stone foundation, with a central brick chimney. A shed-roofed portico, supported by two iron posts, covers the central rectangular south entrance door.

Single rectangular, double-hung, first floor windows, holding six-over-six lights are placed on each side of the south entrance. The windows are flanked by flat pilasters, surmounted by flat lintels and underlined by flat sills.

The interior features original open corner staircase, random width floors and living room mantle piece, decorated with elongated brackets beneath a flat architrave.

At one time this house featured a summer kitchen just north of the building. Today, this is used as a work room and storage shed. It is a one bay wide, one room deep, one story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame structure, with central batten wood south entrance, and 1893 date inscribed on its east wall. This building was owned by John Humphries in 1872, and later his son. The building may have early associations with Avalon.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Humphrie Tenant House faces south on the north side of Rockburn Branch Road, just east of the Goldbeaters' Cottage. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, one story high, gabled roof (running east-west) frame house, resting on a stone foundation, with central brick chimney. Ashed roofed portico, supported by two iron posts, covers the central rectangular south entrance door.

Single rectangular, double-hung, first floor windows, holding six-over-six lights are placed on each side of the south entrance. The windows are flanked by flat pilasters, surmounted by flat lintels and underlined by flat sills.

The west elevation holds a six light first floor window, originally a double-hung window, holding six-over-six lights.

A two light rectangular sliding window was installed in the loft above by the present owners.

The east elevation is similar, holding a central rectangular first floor, double-hung, six-over-six light window with a square loft window above holding an air conditioning unit.

The north elevation once held two batten wood doors, matching the original batten wood door on the south elevation. Now two rectangular, dutch doors, holding nine lights in their upper portion and St. Andrews' cross panels beneath are placed on each side of this north wall.

A one story high, shed roofed, open porch, supported by five iron posts runs along the entire north elevation. The boards are inscribed Davis and Hemphill.

The siding for the house is composed of 12 to 14 inch weathered chestnut boards, similar to those found on the Goldbeaters' Cottage.

The interior features a central mantle piece wall dividing the house in half for a kitchen and living room. A measurement of the downstairs and floor above reveals the general construction of the house. The kitchen is one inch wider than the floor above. In this way the house was braced by building inward.

A Ben Franklin stove is placed on the east wall of the kitchen, utilizing the brick chimney. Original beaded wainscotting with chair rail can be found in the livingroom with the original open staircase located in the CONTINUE ON SEPARATE SHEET IF NECESSARY

northeast corner, along with the original fireplace, decorated with elongated brackets beneath a flat architrave.

At one time this house featured a summer kitchen just north of the building. Today this is used as a work room and storage shed. It is a one bay wide, one room deep, one story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame structure, with central batten wood south entrance and 1893 date inscribed on the north side of its east wall. Two steps lead to the entrance. An east and west six light rectangular window are the only other apertures for this building.

The Brown Tenant House is constructed along the north side of the Rockburn Branch, and just west of the Patapsco River. It is also adjacent to Patapsco State Park, whose boundary line comes up to the line of the buildings entrance portico.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Humphrie Tenant House is significant to Howard County and the State of Maryland architecturally as an example of a modest mid nineteenth century single family dwelling unit and historically through its association with Belmont and Avalon.

Architecturally the building is significant for its basic integrity, remaining much as it was when originally constructed with some modernization to accommodate its present owners.

The building is very similar to its neighbor to the west, the Goldbeaters' Cottage in both interior plan and construction.

The plans of both houses feature two equal downstairs rooms with central dividing wall and loft above. Corner staircases are also featured, but placed, one in the dividing wall, the other in an outside corner. No evidence of a mantle piece exists in the Goldbeaters' Cottage, but the Humphries Tenant House features one. The general construction of both houses is similar. The Goldbeaters' Cottage features log joists and square cut nails. Both houses feature stone foundations, wide boards for siding, random width floors gabled roofs and similar scale and dimensions. Located on the north side of the Rockburn Branch, opposite what residents in the area claim to be the foundation walls for Avalon Iron Works, these cottages may once have been associated with this operation.

Historically, the building can be traced back to the premises or buildings mentioned in a deed dated 5 March, 1872 (32-126) from J. Smith Homans of Bergen County, New Jersey to John Humphries, then of the City of Richmond, Virginia. This deed also mentions the fact that the Avalon Company acquired property adjoining this tract of land on June 20, 1820 (11-384 Anne Arundel Land Records).

A summer kitchen just north of the Humphries Tenant House has a date 1893 scratched on the north side of its east wall with the initials WH.

Mr. J hn Humphries was from England, but after falling in love with an American woman, he decided to make his home here, buying property in this area in 1872 after the Civil War and building his own home on a high ridge of land on the north side of Rockburn Hill Road. Here he later constructed homes for both his son and daughter. His son, John Humphries, was a notable politician in Elkridge. Elizabeth, his daughter, still makes her home here with her family. The land on which the Humphries Tenant House sits once comprised two acres, which included this tenant house and a residence which was constructed circa 1901, when Jack Humphries acquired the property from his father (JHO 74-452).

Later it became the property of the McCauley family, passing to Dennis Edwin Seymour on March 20, 1970 (528-645) and later to the present owners, Henry K and Patricia A. Ostola (583-225).

This tract of land is zoned R-20 and is presently surrounded by undeveloped residential land. In addition it adjoins a State Park, which gives it an enviable location, forever protected by the conservation zone which surrounds it.

Of architectural and historical merit, this building should be considered for inclusion to any historic district or local landmarks legislation the citizens of Howard County might initiate in the Belmont-Lawyers Hill Area, as well as inclusion to the State Criticals Area Program, should its owners so desire.


