The Hoffman Farm faces north on the south side of Route 144, 4/10 of a mile east of its intersection with Route 32.

It is a five bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) stone (covered with stucco) house, resting on a stone foundation, featuring wide brick chimneys inset into its east and west walls, a central, intersecting attic gable on its north facade, and a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, intersecting gable roof (running north-south) frame (covered with clapboard) south wing, resting on a stone foundation, extending from the west side of the main building block's south wall, creating an "L" plan. A wide, central brick chimney is inset into its south wall. A hipped roof, one story high, open porch runs along the east side of the main building block's south wall, connecting with a one story high, shed roofed, open porch running along the entire east elevation of the south wing, supported by six square, wooden posts.

The north facade features a central, rectangular entrance door, covered by a one story high, hipped roof, open porch which runs along this elevation, supported by five turned posts and two pilasters.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hoffman Farm faces north on the south side of Route 144, 4/10 of a mile east of its intersection with Route 32.

It is a five bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) stone (covered with stucco) house, resting on stone foundation, featuring wide, brick chimneys inset into its east and west walls, a central, intersecting attic gable on its north facade, and a two bay wide, one room deep, two story high, intersecting gable roof (running north-south) frame (covered with clapboard) south wing, resting on a stone foundation, extending from the west side of the main building block's south wall, creating an "L" plan. A wide central, brick chimney is inset into its south wing A hipped roof, one story high, open porch runs along the east side of the main building block's south wall, connecting with a one story high, shed roofed, open porch, running along the entire east elevation of the south wing. Six square, wooden posts support its roof.

#### THE NORTH ELEVATION

The north facade features a central, rectangular, cross paneled entrance door, surmounted by a transom and flanked on either side by two rectangular, double-hung windows, holding two-over-two lights, surmounted by flat, wooden lintels, underlined by flat wooden sills and decorated with shutters, all of which is vertically aligned and proportionally scaled to five similar, second floor windows. A one story high, hipped roof, open porch runs along this elevation, supported by five turned posts and two pilasters, held by scrolled brackets. Four wooden steps lead to its landing.

This elevation also features the central intersecting gable, which holds a roman arched, six-over-six light window.

#### THE SOUTH ELEVATION

The east side of the main building block holds a central bay, rectangular, cross paneled door, surmounted by a four light transom. A rectangular, double-hung first floor window rests in the second east bay. The second floor of this section holds two rectangular, double-hung windows, with six-over-six lights, underlined by wooden sills and decorated with green shutters.

The south elevation of the south wing holds a one story high, shed roofed, frame appendage with two, two light, rectangular windows.

This section holds no second floor windows, but two six light, horizontal, rectangular, attic windows.

#### THE WEST ELEVATION OF THE STONE HOUSE

The east and west elevations of the stone house hold two square, four light, attic windows.

### THE EAST ELEVATION OF THE FRAME SOUTH WING

The east elevation of the south wing holds two central bay, rectangular, fifteen light, first floor, entrance doors, flanked by single rectangular, double-hung windows, holding two-overtwo lights. Two similar, second floor windows rest above.

#### THE WEST ELEVATION OF THE FRAME SOUTH WING

The west wall of the south wing holds two first and second floor, rectangular, double-hung, vertically aligned windows, holding two-over-two lights.

Southeast of the house lies a stone smoke house, and outbuildings and south west of the house a frame tenant house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hoffman Farm is significant to Howard County and the State of Maryland historically through its association with the Hammond, Hipsley and Selby families of Howard County and architecturally as a fine example of an early nineteenth century stone building.

Historically, the property can be traced to 1798 when Charles Hammond laid out "Hammond's Discovery". The building is said to have been constructed by 1812. The property can be traced back in the Howard County Land Records to 1836 when Charles A. Hipsley conveyed some 158 acres to William Gibbons. The property passed through several owners, until it was acquired by Mr. Joseph Selby in 1890 and to this day is owned by this same family. Mrs. Ethel Hoffman was only two years old when she moved into the house in 1890. In 1935, the property was willed to Mrs. Ethel Hoffman, and in 1978, she willed the property to her two sons, who are in the process of selling the farm for development.

Architecturally, the building is a notable stone building, two and a half stories high, featuring a wide, central hall and staircase, basement cooking fireplace, hand hewn log joists and stone walls of two feet in depth.



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



