The Ridgely Tenant property is located in a rapidly developing part of Howard County just north of Glenelg, which formerly was known as Isaacsville. It was probably built in the late nineteenth century on the east side of Ivory Road. It was remembered as a dirt road by the current owner, just north of its intersection with Tridelphia Road. This section of roadway has been bypassed twice with the abandoned Ten Oaks Road roadbed located between the house and the present MD 32. Thus the house is wedged on a small lot between Ivory Road on the west, Ten Oaks Road on the east, and Burnt Woods Road on the north. New subdivision housing is encroaching on the site.

The property is the location of poorly maintained, simple, rectangular, late nineteenth century, two-story frame dwelling, and a few frame outbuildings (garage, chicken coop and meathouse). On the first level the dwelling, clad with German siding, has five bays with dual entrances on the west entrance facade, with three bays on the second level. The gable roof (metal) parallels the north - south orientation of this elevation. The entrance is sheltered by a full width porch with pyramidal roof. Chimneys are located at the ridgeline -- one on the south wall of the north parlor and the other built for stoves inside the south gable end. Ventilator windows are located near the peak at both gable ends. The cornices are not boxed, as is usual, and the purlin ends are exposed at each end. The building is sheathed with wood German siding.

A one story full width enclosed porch is located on the rear (or east) elevation. A seam in the siding may reflect that the porch was enclosed at different times. Cornerboards appear at all four corners. In the gable ends the second story is devoid of windows, but the first level has two windows.


The owner reports that the structure has three rooms on both the first and second stories. The north parlor (with fireplace on the south wall) and the south parlor (with chimney designed for a woodstove on south wall) separated by a kitchen, with a winder stair in the northeast corner. The kitchen evidently suffered a disastrous fire while it was lived in by the Owens family, who enclosed the back porch.


To the rear of the structure (east) is located a board and batten garage, with a frame meathouse located northeast of the dwelling across the driveway from the garage.

Statement of Significance Continuation Sheet 8.1

The Ridgely Tenant House is composed of an unremarkable ensemble of frame structures wedged into a tiny lot at the junction of three roadways. The late - nineteenth century dwelling, in a dilapidated state, may have been constructed as an ancillary or tenant house by Ruben Ridgely in the late nineteenth century. The property is a marginally significant representative example of sites of around the turn of the century that are still abundant in Maryland.
