The 1947 vernacular dwelling at 11139 Johns Hopkins Road consists of a 1-1/2-story, side gable

wood frame building set on a concrete block foundation. Clad in asbestos shingles, the house

features two prominent gable roof dormers with wide eaves and exposed rafter tails at the front

and one at the rear of the house. A one-story, three-bay, shed-roof porch enclosed by a frame

knee wall projects from the facade. A single exterior end chimney constructed of stretcher bond

brick rises at the southwest elevation. The house has been altered by the construction of two

wood frame additions at the rear of the dwelling, one one-story and the other two. The original

2/1 windows remain in place in the original dwelling. The window and door trim throughout

consists of simple square-edged wood moldings with slight overhanging ears.

The house was erected for Vincent V. and Elizabeth C. Wehland in 1947. Shortly thereafter, the

The 1947 dwelling, vernacular in design, at 11139 Johns Hopkins Road consists of a 1-1/2-story, side gable wood frame building set on a concrete block foundation. Clad in asbestos shingles, the house features two prominent gable roof dormers with wide eaves and exposed rafter tails at the front and one at the rear of the house. A one-story, three-bay, shed-roof porch enclosed by a frame knee wall projects from the facade. A single exterior end chimney constructed of stretcher bond brick rises at the southwest elevation. The house has been altered by the construction of two wood frame additions at the rear of the dwelling, one one-story and the other two. The original 2/1 windows remain in place in the original dwelling. The window and door trim throughout consists of simple square-edged wood moldings with slight overhanging ears.

Erected in 1947, the dwelling at 11139 Johns Hopkins Road occupies an irregularly shaped lot containing approximately three acres. The site, which is mainly level, is scattered with mature trees. A stand of fir trees bounds the property on the southwest. A curved driveway approaches the house from the south, and a slight slope extends downward towards the rear of the property. An well-kept garden occupies the rear yard.

### EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION:

The southeast facade elevation displays four identical 2/1 windows arranged symmetrically around a central main entrance, which holds a single-leaf, panel-and-light door. The upper half story is lighted on this elevation by one 2/1 window set in each of two gable front dormers.

At the northeast elevation, due to the slope of the property the foundation of the house is exposed at the rear. The foundation wall is pierced by one replacement 2/2 window and one six-light hopper window with a brick sill. The first story contains two 2/1, wood sash windows of different sizes and two single-light casement windows. The upper half story contains a single 2/1 window.

The two additions at the rear are pierced by windows in the foundation wall. The southwest addition contains a 2/1 awning window at the basement level and one 1/1 window on the first story. The other addition holds a six-light wood awning window with a rowlock sill at the basement story and a metal-frame sliding glass door at the first story. The addition is topped by a five-light fixed metal window at the second story. The original dormer on the

northwest elevation contains two 2/1 windows.

The basement story of the southwest elevation contains two sixlight hopper windows in the original portion of the house, while one two-light hopper window pierces the basement wall on the rear addition. In addition a single-leaf, panel-and-light door opens into the basement at the rear elevation. Three window bays pierce the southwest elevation's first story. Two of these are located within the confines of the original dwelling, one holding a single 2/1 window and the other a pair of the same type of windows. The rear addition contains a single 1/1 window. The upper half story of the original dwelling is pierced by a 2/1 window. The southwest elevation is also divided by the exterior end chimney constructed of stretcher bond brick.

#### **OUTBUILDINGS:**

A 1960s, aluminum -clad, wood frame garage stands just west of the main dwelling. This building has a front gable roof sheathed in asphalt shingles, frame walls clad in aluminum siding, and a full-width sliding wood doors. The garage is lighted by 6/6 windows on its northeast elevation.

Three other outbuildings are associated with the dwelling at 11139 Johns Hopkins Road. These include one 1970s, frame animal pen set on a concrete block foundation and capped by a shed roof; a 1960s concrete block, shed-roofed coop, and a 1950s concrete block barn with a standing seam sheet metal gable roof.

This modest vernacular dwelling was erected for Vincent V. and Elizabeth C. Wehland in 1947. Shortly thereafter, the property was transferred to relatives, Laurence V. and Jackquetta C. Wehland in 1953. In 1968, the property passed to Olivers who are the current owners.

The dwelling is typical of numerous modest residences erected in rural Maryland in the 1930s and 1940s. The house displays common features of its style including its prominent dormers, wide eaves, and 2/1 windows. Although altered by two additions, the house retains its original materials and detailing.

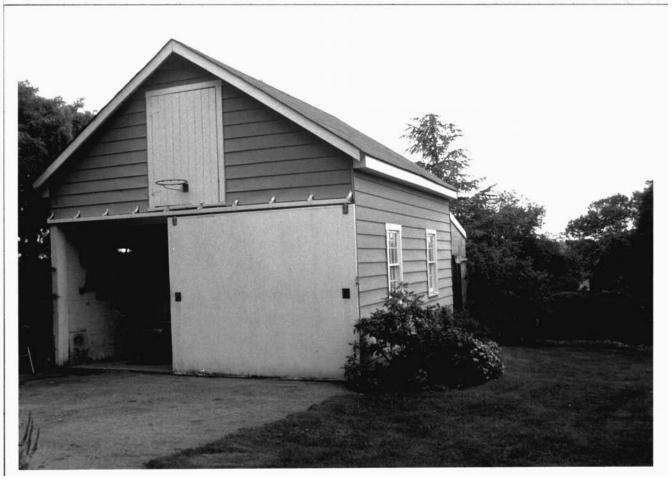

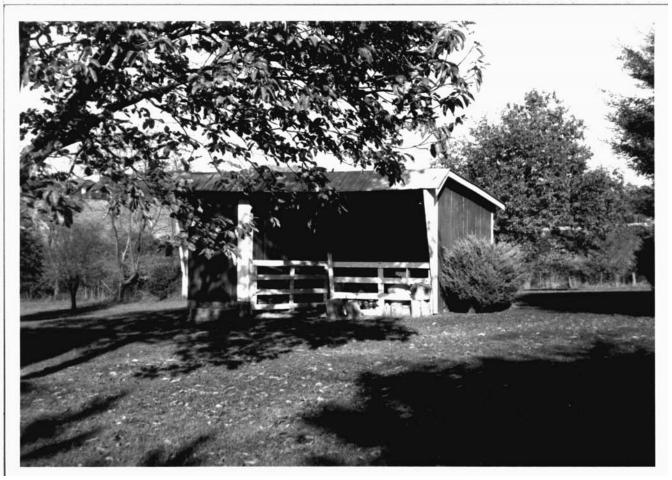

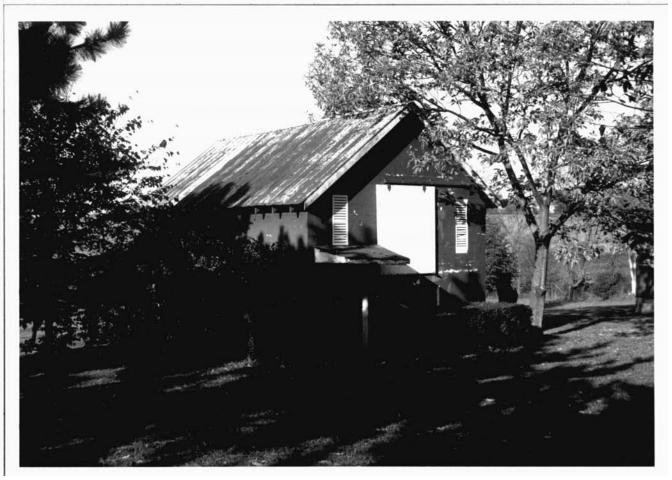
