### CAPSULE SUMMARY

8449 Leishear Road (HO-688)

The 1939 1-1/2-story Bungalow at 8449 Leishear Road is rectangular in plan and set on a solid stuccoed foundation. The wood frame walls are clad in vinyl siding, and the facade is embellished by a front gable portico set on turned wood posts. An interior, corbeled-cap brick chimney pierces the building's front gable roof. The house retains its original form, but has been altered by the enclosure of the rear porch, the addition of aluminum siding, and the replacement of the windows and front entrance door. Easily constructed and affordable, this dwelling provides an example of the modest Bungalow as commonly constructed throughout Scaggsville, and across America, in the 1920s and 1930s.

The parcel was a portion of a large tract of land originally in the possession of Seth Warfield, who acquired the property in 1858. The land passed into the Harding family in 1895. By 1924, the property comprised 42 acres. In December 1939, Basil W. and Annie Harding sold a portion of this 42 acres to James A. and Katherine B. Coon who erected the present house. The Coons owned the house for less than three years, transferring it and the property to Ellnetta E. and Edgar Buckingham in 1941. The Buckinghams possessed the property for over fifty years, until they conveyed it to the Hillman family in 1996. The current owners, the Hamblins, acquired the property later that year, in December 1996.

The 1939 1-1/2-story Bungalow at 8449 Leishear Road is rectangular in plan and set on a solid stuccoed foundation. The wood frame walls are clad in vinyl siding, and the facade is embellished by a front gable portico set on turned wood posts. An interior, corbeled-cap brick chimney pierces the building's front gable roof. The house retains its original form, but has been altered by the enclosing of the rear porch, the addition of aluminum siding and the replacement of the windows and front entrance door.

The dwelling at 8449 Leishear Road stands on a sloping site on the east side of Leishear Road. The property that consists of 19,994 square feet slopes slightly to the south and backs to a densely wooded area. Scattered bushes and mature shade trees surround the house.

### **EXTERIOR BUILDINGS:**

The west elevation, the facade, is three bays wide. At the first story the center bay contains a flush-with-lights wood door. The door is flanked on either side by replacement 1/1 metal sash windows encased in metal. The upper half story of the west elevation is marked by an original 3-light wood awning window.

The south elevation contains three openings, two filled with a single 1/1 metal sash window and the third with a pair of 1/1 metal windows.

At the east elevation, a portion of the original rear wall of the bungalow is obscured by a one-story enclosed porch. One 1/1 metal sash window pierces the rear wall of the main body of the building, and another pierces the enclosed and extended porch. A single-leaf panel-and-light wood door provides access at the rear of the porch extension. An original 3-light awning window remains in the upper half-story of the east elevation.

The north elevation of the dwelling contains four 1/1 metal sash windows and a bulkhead entry to the basement.

#### **OUTBUILDINGS:**

Two outbuildings are associated with the property at 8449 Leishear Road. One, a wood frame guest house, dates from the 1920s or 1930s, and based on its foundation appears to have been moved to its current location. Located near the northeast corner of the

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property, the 1-story, frame guesthouse is set on a concrete block foundation, clad in vinyl siding, and covered with an asphalt shingled side gable roof. Its west elevation contains three openings: a centered, multi-light, Craftsman-style wood door, and two flanking 1/1, double-hung wood sash windows. A new flush wood door has been added on the south elevation. Dating to the 1970s, the second associated building is a small frame doghouse constructed of plywood and covered by a gable roof. The doghouse stands just southwest of the guesthouse.

The house at 8449 Leishear Road is one of several early-to-mid twentieth century residences erected on the east and west sides of Leishear Road during the 1930s and 1940s. The predominant style of this residential section of Scaggsville is the modest Bungalow. The Bungalow was popular because it provided homeowners with affordable housing which was easily constructed and maintained.




