## **CAPSULE SUMMARY**

10571 Scaggsville Road (HO-701)

The modest 1914 bungalow at 10571 Scaggsville Road is a one-and-one-half-story, side gable and hip extension roof dwelling with a front gable roof dormer. The original wood frame dwelling sits on a solid, concrete, parged foundation. The house is clad in asbestos shingles and the roof is covered of asphalt shingles. There is an interior chimney with a brick corbeled cap which rises out of the southeast end of the original house. The original one story porch on the northeast has been enclosed. The addition of a second enclosed porch, which extends across the entire elevation, was made to the southeast side of the house. Subsequent construction of a one story, wood frame addition on the southeast corner and a one story, hipped roof, wood frame addition on the southeast corner have enlarged the original house.

The house was constructed during Ambrose M. and Mazie C. Goldsmith's ownership of the current lot. The Goldsmith family acquired the property in 1905 and sold it in 1919, after the construction of the original house. The Souders, a prominent Scaggsville family, bought the property in 1920 and retained ownership for almost seventy years. In 1988, the Souders sold the property to the Raymonds. Following a divorce, Charlotte Ann Townsend (formerly Raymond) acquired sole interest in the property, and between 1992 and 1994, conveyed all her interest in the property to her daughter and son-in-law, the Mersons.

The 1914 Craftsman-style house at 10571 Scaggsville Road is a one-and-one-half-story, side gable and hip extension roof dwelling with a front gable roof dormer. The original wood frame dwelling sits on a solid, concrete, parged foundation. The house is clad in asbestos shingles and the roof is covered of asphalt shingles. There is an interior chimney with a brick corbeled cap which rises out of the southeast end of the original house. The original one story porch on the northeast has been enclosed. The addition of a second enclosed porch, which extends across the entire elevation, was made to the southeast side of the house. Subsequent construction of a one story, wood frame addition on the southwest corner and a one story, hipped roof, wood frame addition on the southeast corner have enlarged the original house.

The dwelling is located at the south corner of Scaggsville Road and Harding Road. The house sits on a large lot which slopes down to the north. Low shrubs surround the house while the property is dotted with mature trees. A chain-link fence encloses the southwest portion of the lot.

### **EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION:**

The northeast elevation, the facade of the house, is one-and-one-half stories in height and contains a one story enclosed porch at the first story. The side gable roof with a hip extension features a centered, front gable dormer. The one-story southeast addition is flush with the front elevation on the eastern corner of the house. The entrance to the house, within the enclosed porch, is marked with a single leaf, flush metal door with a metal surround. The first story is pierced by two replacement, 1/1 metal sash windows with wood surrounds and molded sills. The porch is enclosed by nine non-original, jalousie windows. The dormer is pierced by two replacement, 1/1 metal sash windows with wood surrounds and square-edged sills.

The northwest elevation is pierced at the first story by two non-original, jalouise windows on the enclosed porch, two replacement, 1/1 metal sash windows with square-edged casings on the original section of the house, and one non-original, 1/1 metal sash window with square-edged casings on the southwest addition. The upper half-story of the original house is pierced by two replacement, 1/1 metal sash windows with square-edged casings.

marked by a single-leaf, paneled door with lights and a metal surround. The first story of the original house is pierced by one 1/1 non-original, metal sash window with square-edged casings. The southwest addition is pierced on the first story by one 1/1 nonoriginal, metal sash window with a square-edged surround.

The southeast elevation consists of the added one-story porch which covers the entire first story of the elevation. Behind the porch, the first story is pierced by one non-original, double-leaf, multilight metal door with a wood surround. Also behind the porch, the first story is marked by four non-original, 1/1 metal sash windows with wood surrounds and molded sills. The half story above contains two replacement, 1/1 metal sash windows with wood surrounds and square-edged sills.

#### **OUTBUILDINGS:**

Two outbuildings stand to the south of the main house. The first one is a wood frame garage constructed in the 1950s with a front gable roof and vertical board siding. The second outbuilding is a pre-fabricated wood frame shed with a gambrel roof and vertical board siding.

Built in 1914, the house at 10571 Scaggsville Road is an early illustration of the modest Bungalow which was prevalent in rural areas across America in the 1920s and 1930s. This derivation of the Bungalow was popular because it provided homeowners with affordable housing that was easy to construct and maintain.

The house was constructed during Ambrose M. and Mazie C. Goldsmith's ownership of the current lot. The Goldsmith family acquired the property in 1905 and sold it in 1919, after the construction of the original house. The Souders, a prominent Scaggsville family, bought the property in 1920 and retained ownership for almost seventy years. In 1988, the Souders sold the property to the Raymonds. Following a divorce, Charlotte Ann Townsend (formerly Raymond) acquired sole interest in the property, and between 1992 and 1994, conveyed all her interest in the property to her daughter and son-in-law, the Mersons.

Despite the alterations made to the house, the dwelling at 10571 Scaggsville Road is characteristic of modest, residential architecture built in the Scaggsville area during the early-to-mid twentieth century.




