The Board of County School Commissioners of Howard County purchased the property in 1890

school was locally known as the Welsh's School, later becoming known as the Highridge School.

Since its renovation for use as a dwelling, the building has been altered to feature two front gable dormers subsequently added on the northeast roof plane. A one story, front gable ell addition of wood frame with a poured concrete foundation has been constructed on the west side of the building.

The building is set on a deep corner lot at the east intersection of Scaggsville Road and Harding Road. The property is level and grassy with scattered mature trees. A large tree on the west side of the main house dominates the landscape. The house sits ten feet to the southwest of Scaggsville Road, and a chain-link fence surrounds the majority of the property. A wood fence lines part of the northwest edge of the property.

EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION:

The northeast elevation, or the facade of the building, fronts directly on the road. It is divided into four bays with a central entry marked by a wood frame hood set on wood brackets. Not historically an opening, the entry is filled with a wood paneled door with lights and a metal surround. It is flanked by paired 6/6 windows with wood sills, square-edged surrounds, and thick mullions. A set of paired half-size windows cut into the southern end of the elevation. The roof is pierced by two non-original front gable dormers, proportionally out-of-scale to the building. Each has a 1/1 metal sash windows with metal surrounds.

The northwest elevation consists of a one story, shed roof addition. This addition contains a 6/6 metal sash window and a single entry opening with an aluminum door. The elevation of the original block of the building has a single opening in the gable end, filled with a 1/1 replacement sash of metal. The concrete block exterior end chimney, present when the building was used as

a school, projects through the overhanging eaves to rise above the roofline.

Dominated by the ell addition, the southwest elevation has two original window openings, one of which has been enlarged. Despite the difference in opening size, each contains a 6/6 metal sash. The ell is pierced on the southwest and southeast elevations by two identical 1/1 metal sash windows. The northwest elevation has a similar 1/1 window set north of the single entry opening. Accessible by a wood deck, the opening has an aluminum door.

The southeast elevation of the main block appears to most intact. The first story has a single-leaf entry with a glass and wood door flanked by a 6/6 window. Although the door and window sash are replacements, the openings are original. The gable end has a single window with a 1/1 metal sash trimmed with metal surrounds.

OUTBUILDINGS:

To the west of the main house is a small one story, pre-fabricated, metal shed with a side gable roof, constructed in the 1960s.






