CAPSULE SUMMARY

10710 Scaggsville Road

(HO-706)

The circa 1915 Bungalow at 10710 Scaggsville Road is a one-and-one-half-story, three-bay

residence with a front gable roof. The original wood frame house sits on a solid, panel-faced,

concrete block foundation. The dwelling has been reclad in aluminum siding and the roof is

covered in asphalt shingles. There is an interior brick chimney laid in stretcher bond. A one

story, three-bay porch supported by square columns extends across the entire southwest facade

of the residence.

The dwelling is an early example of the modest Bungalow, so popular throughout Scaggsville

from the 1910s through the 1940s. The Bungalow was affordable for working-class families and

could easily be embellished with simplified Craftsman-style detailing, which in this case included

a panel-faced concrete block foundation, a full width porch with square columns, 3/1 windows,

and wide overhanging eaves. The Bungalow, with its ease of construction and maintenance,

swept across rural America during this period.

The dwelling was most likely constructed by the Hines family who purchased the property in

1904 from Joseph D. Harding. The Hines family retained ownership of the property until 1929,

when it was sold to Albert H. and Annie E. Scaggs. The Scaggs held the property until 1988,

at which time they conveyed it to the current owners, Don M. and Katherine M. Fansler.

The circa 1915 Bungalow is a one-and-one-half-story, three-bay residence with a front gable roof. The original wood frame house sits on a solid, panel-faced, concrete block foundation. The dwelling has been reclad in aluminum siding and the roof is covered in asphalt shingles. There is an interior brick chimney laid in stretcher bond. A one story, three-bay porch supported by square columns extends across the entire southwest facade of the residence. The original form of the residence has remained much the same as it originally appeared, with only a small wood frame addition with a raised, concrete block basement at the rear.

The house at 10710 Scaggsville Road is located to the northeast of Scaggsville Road. The property slopes gently to the away from the road. Mature trees dominate the site to the west and foundation plantings surround the house. A large fenced garden sits to the northeast of the residence.

EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION:

The southwest elevation, the facade of the house, consists the gable end wall. The three-bay elevation is symmetrical, with the main entrance in the center bay. The doorway is filled with a single-leaf, multi-light door. Flanking the doorway are paired 3/1 windows. The upper half-story is marked with a one-light awning window. The one-story, three-bay porch with square columns and a matchstick balustrade extends across this elevation.

The foundation wall of the southeast elevation of the original house is pierced by two original, three-light awning windows and an original, single leaf, panel-and-light door. The raised basement level of the northeast addition is pierced by a non-original, single leaf, wood, vertical board door. The first story of the original house is divided into three bays. The southern bay is marked by a 3/1 window, the center by a pair of 3/1 windows, and the northern by a pair of non-original, 1/1 aluminum sash windows. The first story of the addition is pierced by a 3/1 window.

The original foundation and first story of the northeast elevation is entirely occupied by the one story, wood frame addition with a raised, concrete block basement. The foundation of the addition is pierced by two non-original, six-light, awning windows. The first story is pierced by a single-leaf, panel-and-light metal door and by a group of three non-original, 1/1 windows. The half story of the original rear wall of the house is marked with an original, one-light, awning window.

The foundation of the northwest elevation is pierced by one two-light awning window and one three-light awning window. The first story is divided into three bays. Each of the outer bays is expressed with a single 3/1 window, while the center bay is marked with a 1/1 metal sash window.

OUTBUILDINGS:

One outbuilding resides to the east of the main house. The garage, which probably dates from the late 1950s or early 1960s, is a one story, concrete block building with a concrete pad and a front gable roof.




