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CAPSULE SUMMARY

Bobby's Scaggsville Station 10919A Scaggsville Road (HO-713)

Constructed as a gas station, Bobby's Scaggsville Station at 10919A Scaggsville Road was designed as a bungalow with Craftsman-style influences. The one-story, low-slung building has an L-shaped plan and is covered with a hipped roof. Set on a parged concrete foundation, the gas station features a deep porte cochere at the front and a single interior brick chimney set near the rear of the building at the intersection of the arms of the "L." The wood frame walls are clad in asbestos shingles. The porte cochere is supported on square wood posts and features exposed rafters on its underside. Many of the building's original features remain, including the 1/1 windows, the panel-and-light doors, and the exposed rafters beneath the overhanging eaves.

The gas station at 10919A Scaggsville Road was erected by the Hines family in 1937. Mentioned in the deed of sale dated July 8, 1944, the station was one of the early modern filling stations in the Scaggsville area. Its form is typical of rural gas stations built throughout the United States during the 1910s, 1920s, and 1930s. Craftsman in style, these stations often served as combination general store and filling station in areas remote from urban centers. Members of the Hines family owned and operated the gas station from its inception and still own the property today.

An interior brick chimney rises above the intersection of the rear hip and the ridge of the gable roof ell.

Part of a 1.673 acre property that includes the dwelling next door at 10919B Scaggsville Road, the gas station at 10919A occupies a small property which backs up onto rolling pasture lands. Set close to southwestern edge of Scaggsville Road, the building is fronted by a sizable asphalt parking/service area with gas pumps standing beneath the wide porte cochere.

EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION:

The facade, the northeast elevation of the filling station, comprises two wall planes, the projecting commercial facade in the hipped roof section of the building and the more private side elevation of the ell. Within the projecting section there is a central entrance marked by a single-leaf, five-panel, four-light door. To either side of the main entrance is a pair of large 1/1 windows. Along the northeast elevation of the ell, two 1/1 windows and one panel-and-light door pierce the wall. All openings are trimmed with the same square-edged casings.

The northwest wall is pierced in the gable end of the ell by a single 1/1 window. The southwest elevation contains three window bays. One bay on this elevation has been closed with plywood, while the other two are filled with 1/1 windows. Square-edged casings surround each of these openings. The southeast elevation is penetrated by four openings. The outer two hold 1/1 windows with square-edged trim while each of the inner openings contains a five-panel wood door.

Its form is typical of rural gas stations built throughout the United States during the 1910s, 1920s, and 1930s. Craftsman in style, these stations often served as combination general store and filling station in areas remote from urban centers.

The Hines family settled this area as early as 1924, having acquired this property in the late 1910s. At that time John L. Hines purchased two tracts of land from which the current 1.673 acres is derived. The residence at 10909 Scaggsville Road was built in 1924, and the adjacent bungalow at 10919B Scaggsville Road is contemporary with the filling station. Members of the Hines family owned and operated the gas station from its inception and still own the property today.




