There are no parapets on either side of the structure. Heavy concrete copings have been constructed on the top of the spandrel walls, which have been heavily parged with concrete except for a few areas in which the stone is visible. None of the stones of the arch rings are visible because of this heavy parging. The south spandrel wall shows considerable deterioration with dislodging of stone. According to Small Structures on Maryland's Roadways: Historic Context Report (1997), on page 4-8 and 4-9, the Character Defining Elements of small masonry culverts and structures are the arch rings, barrels, spandrel walls and parapets for the superstructure, and abutments and wingwalls for the substructures. To be eligible under both Criterion A


and C at least one side of the stone arch would need to be exposed since aesthetics were a consideration in the construction

of the small stone arches. None of the components of the arch rings are visible on this structure.
