

Based on the information provided by SHA, Small Structure X13064X0 does not appear to meet the Maryland Register criteria. The small structure has an 8-foot long span and carries MI 144 over a small stream in Howard County. The stone arch structure was probably constructed in the early to mid 19th century. The original structure is in very poor condition, has severely compromised integrity and is barely visible. Located at grade with the existing roadway, it has no parapet walls. The coping has been replaced with cast-in-place concrete with a guard rail attached. The south face of the structure is so heavily parged that the stone is barely apparent. The north face has numerous areas of missing mortar. A portion of the arch barrel has deteriorated and requires extensive repairs. Although the bridge may be associated with important developments in Maryland's transportation history (MD 144 was constructed in the first decades of the 19th century as the Baltimore and Frederick Turnpike as constructed in the first decades of the 19th century as the Baltimore and Frederick Turnpike sufficient integrity to represent the era of turnpike construction nor is it any longer a good example of the small stone arch structures which were built in large numbers along the states early highways. It is not associated with any known significant person. Thus, it does not appear likely to meet any of the criteria. It is not located in known historic district.


