## 21.0 STANDARD AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR TOPSOIL

#### DEFINITION

Placement of topsoil over a prepared subsoil prior to establishment of permanent

To provide a suitable soil medium for vegetative growth. Soils of concern have low moisture content, low nutrient levels, low pH, materials toxic to plants, and/or unacceptable soll gradation.

#### CONDITIONS WHERE PRACTICE APPLIES

- I. This practice is limited to areas having 2:1 or flatter slopes where:
- a. The texture of the exposed subsoil/parent material is not adequate to produce vegetative growth.
- b. The soil material is so shallow that the rooting zone is not deep enough to support plants or furnish continuing supplies of moisture and plant
- c. The original soil to be vegetated contains material toxic to plant growth.
- d. The soll is so acidic that treatment with limestone is not feasible.
- II. For the purpose of these Standards and Specifications, areas having slopes steeper than 2:1 require special consideration and design for adequate stabilization. Areas having slopes steeper than 2:1 shall have the appropriate stabilization shown on the plans.

#### CONSTRUCTION AND MATERIAL SPECIFICATIONS

- I. Topsoll salvages from the existing site may be used provided that is meets the standards as set forth in these specifications. Typically, the depth of topsoll to be salvaged for a given soll type can be found in the representative soil profile section in the Soil Survey published by USDA-SCS in cooperation with Maryland Agricultural Experimental Station.
- II. Topsoil Specifications Soil to be used as topsoil must meet the following:
- i. Topsoil shall be a loam, sandy loam, clay loam, silt loam, sandy clay loam, loamy sand. Other soils may be used if recommended by an agronomist or soil scientist and approved by the appropriate appropriate approval authority. Regardless, topsoll shall not be a mixture of contrasting textured subsolls and shall contain less than 5% by volume of cinders, stones, slag, coarse fragments, gravel, sticks, roots, trash, or other materials larger than 1-1/2% in dlameter.
- ii. Topsoil must be free of plants or plant parts such as bermuda grass, quackgrass. Johnsongrass, nutsedge, poison ivy, thistic, or others as
- lil. Where the subsoil is either highly acidic or composed of heavy clays, ground limestone shall be spread at the rate of 4-8 tons/acre (200-400 pounds per 1,000 square feet) prior to the placement of topsoil. Lime shall be distributed uniformly over designated areas and worked into the soll in conjunction with tillage operations as described in the following procedures.
- II. For sites having disturbed areas under 5 acres:
- i. On soil meeting Topsoil specifications, obtain test results dictating fertilizer and lime amendments required to bring the soil into compliance with the followina:
- a. pH for topsoil shall be between 6.0 and 7.5. If the tested soil demonstrates a pH of less than 6.0, sufficient lime shall be prescribed to raise the pH to 6.5 or higher.
- b. Organic content of topsoil shall be not less than 1.5 percent by
- c. Topsoil having soluble salt content greater than 500 parts per million shall not be used.
- d. No sod or seed shall be placed on soil which has been treated with soil sterilants or chemicals used for weed control until sufficient time has elapsed (14 days min.) to permit dissipation of phyto-toxic

Note: Topsoll substitutes or amendments, as recommended by a qualified agronomist or soil scientist and approved by the appropriate approval authority, may be used in lieu of natural topsoil.

li. Place topsoil (if required) and apply soil amendments as specified in 20.0 Vegetative Stabilization - Section I - Vegetative Stabilization Methods and Materials.

# V. Topsoil Application

- I. When topsoiling, maintain needed erosion and sediment control practices such as diversions, Grade Stabilization Structures, Earth Dikes, Slope Silt Fence and Sediment Traps and Basins.
- ii. Grades on the areas to be topsoiled, which have been previously established, shall be maintained, albeit 43/8 - 83/8 higher in elevation.
- iii. Topsoll shall be uniformly distributed in a 4% 8% layer and lightly compacted to a minimum thickness of 4%. Spreading shall be performed in such a manner that sodding or seeding can proceed with a minimum of additional soil preparation and tillage. Any irregularities in the surface resulting from topsoiling or other operations shall be corrected in order to prevent the formation of depressions or water
- iv. Topsoil shall not be placed while the topsoil or subsoil is in a frozen or muddy condition, when the subsoil is excessively wet or in a condition that may otherwise be detrimental to proper grading and seedbed
- VI. Alternative for Permanent Seeding instead of applying the full amounts of lime and commercial fertilizer, composted sludge and amendments may be applied as specified below:
  - i. Composted Sludge Material for use as a soil conditioner for sites having disturbed areas over 5 acres shall be tested to prescribe amendments and for sites having disturbed areas under 5 acres shall conform to the following requirements:
  - a. Composted sludge shall be supplied by, or originate from, a person or persons that are permitted (at the time of acquisition of the compost) by the Maryland Department of the Environment under
  - b. Composted sludge shall contain at least 1 percent nitrogen, 1.5 percent phosphorus, and 0.2 percent potassium and have a Ph of 7.0 to 8.0. If compost does not meet these requirements, the appropriate constituents must be added to meet the requirements
  - c. Composted sludge shall be applied at a rate of 1 ton/1,000 square
- iv. Composted sludge shall be amended with a potassium fertilizer applied at a rate of 4 lb/1,000 square feet, and 1/3 the normal lime application

#### PERMANENT SEEDING NOTES

Apply to graded or cleared areas not subject to immediate further disturbance where a permanent long-lived vegetative cover is needed.

Seedbed preparation: Loosen upper three inches of soil by raking, disking or other acceptable means before seeding, if not previously loosened.

Soil amendments: In lieu of soil test recommendations, use one of the following

1. <u>Preferred</u> - Apply 2 tons per acres Dolomitic Limestone (92 lbs/1000 sq. ft.) and 1000 lbs. per acre 10-10-10 fertilizer (14 lbs/1000 sq. ft.) before seeding. Harrow or disk into upper three inches of soil. At time of seeding, apply 400 lbs. per acre 30-0-0 Ureaform Fertilizer (9 lbs/1000 sq.ft.)

2. Acceptable - Apply 2 tone per acre Dolomitic Limestone (92 lbs./1000 eq.ft.) and 1000 lbs. per acre 10-10-10 fertilizer (23 lbs./1000eq.ft.) before seeding. Harrow or disk into upper three inches of soil.

Geeding - For the periode March 1 thru April 30, and August 1 thru October 15, seed with 60 lbs. per acre (1.4 lbs./1000sq.ft.) of Kentucky 31 tall feecue. For the period May 1 thru July 31 seed with 60 lbs. Kentucky 31 tall fescus per acre and 2 lbs. per acre (.05 lbs/1000sq.ft.) of weeping lovegrass. During the period of October 16 thru February 28, protect site by: Option (1) - 2 tons per acre of well anchored straw mulch and seed as soon as possible in the spring. Option (2) - Use sod. Option (3) - seed with 60 lbs/acre Kentucky 31 tall fescue and mulch with 2 tons/acre well

Mulching - Apply 1-1/2 to 2 tone per acre (70 - 90 lbs./1000eq.ft.) of unrotted small grain straw immediately after seeding. Anchor mulch immediately after applications using mulch anchoring tool or 218 gallons per acre (5 gal/1000sq.ft.) of emulsified asphalt on flat areas. On slopes 8 feet or higher, use 348 gallons per acre (8 gal/1000eq.ft.) for anchoring.

Maintenance - Inspect all seeding areas and make needed repairs, replacements

### TEMPORARY SEEDING NOTES

PERMANENT SEEDING NOTES

Apply to graded or cleared areas likely to be redisturbed where a short-term vegetative cover is needed

Seedbed preparation - Loosen upper three inches of soil by raking, disking or other acceptable means before seeding, if not previously loosened.

Soil amendments - Apply 600 lbs. per acre 10-10-10 fertilizer (14 lbs./1000eq.ft.)

Seeding - For the periods March 1 thru April 30, and August 15 thru October 15, seed with 2-1/2 bushelper acre of annual rys (3.2 lbs./1000sq.ft.). For the period May 1 thru August 14, seed with 3 lbs. per acre of weeping lovegrass (.07 lbs./1000sq.ft.). For the period November 16 thru February 28, protect site by applying 2 tons per acre of well anchored straw mulch and seed as soon as possible in the spring, or use sod.

Mulching - Apply 1-1/2 to 2 tone per acre (70 - 90 lbs./1000sq.ft.) of unrotted weed free small grain straw immediately after seeding. Anchor mulch immediately after application using mulch anchoring tool or 218 gal. per acre (5 gal./1000 eq.ft.) of emulsified aephalt on flat areas. On slopes 8 ft. or higher. Use 348 gal. per acre (8 gal./1000 eq.ft.) for anchoring.

Refer to the 1994 Maryland Standarde and Specifications for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control for additional rates and methods not covered.

# 1. A minimum of 24 hours notice must be given to the Howard County Office of Inspections and Permits prior to the start of any construction (992-2437).

- 2. All vegetative and structural practices are to be installed according to the provisions of this plan and are to be in conformance with the 1994 Maryland Standards and Specifications for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control."
- 3. Following initial soil disturbance or redisturbance, permanent or temporary stabilization shall be completed within:
- A. Seven calendar days for all perimeter sediment control structures, dikes, perimeter slopes and all slopes greater than 3:1
- B. Fourteen days as to all other disturbed or graded areas on the project site
- 4. All sediment traps/basing shown must be fenced and warning signs posted around their perimeter in accordance with Vol. 1, Chapter 12, of the "Howard County Design Manual," storm drainage.
- 5. All disturbed areas must be stabilized within the time period specified above in accordance with the 1994 Maryland Standards and Specifications for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control for permanent seedings, sod, temporary seeding, and mulching (section G). Temporary stabilization with mulch alone can only be done when recommended seeding dates do not allow for proper germination and establishment of grasses.
- 6. All sediment control structures are to remain in place and are to be maintained in operative condition until permission for their removal has been obtained from the Howard County Sediment Control Inspector.



- 2. Drive the 2" x 4" construction grade lumber posts 1' into the ground at each corner of the inlet. Place nail strips between the posts on the ends of the inlet. Assemble the top portion of the 2" x 4" frame using the overlap joint shown on Detail. The top of the frame (weir) must be 6" below adjacent roadways where flooding and safety issues may arise.

3. Stretch the 1/2" x 1/2" wire mesh tightly around the frame and fasten securely. The ends must meet and overlap at a

- 4. Stretch the Geotextlle Class E tightly over the wire mosh with the geotixtile extending from the top of the frame to 18° below the inlet notch elevation. Fasten the geotextile firmly to the frame. The ends of the geotextile must meet at a post, be overlapped and folded, then fastened down.
- 5. Backfill around the inlet in compacted 6" layers until the layer of earth is level with the notch elevation on the ends and top elevation on the sides.
- 6. If the inlet is not in a sump, construct a compacted earth dike across the ditch line directly below it. The top of the earth dike should be at least 6" higher than the top of the frame.

7. The structure must be inspected periodically and after each rain and the geotextile replaced when it becomes clogged.


